

Use of BOS tenses with Personal Pronouns

Listed below are the third person singular tenses of BOS (to be) and how they can assist you to say what you wish to say;

Personal Pronouns

Me - I

Te – You (singular)

Ev – He

Hy – She

Ny – We

Why – You (plural or polite)

Y – They

Present tense (short form)

Me yw – I am

Te yw – You are

Ev yw – He is

Hy yw – She is

Ny yw – We are

Why yw – You are

Y yw – They are

Past tense (short form)

Me O – I was

Te O – You were

Ev O – He was

Hy O – She was

Ny O – We were

Why O – You were

Y O – They were

Future tense

Me a vëdh – I will be

Te a vëdh – You will be

Ev a vëdh – He will be

Hy a vëdh – She will be

Ny a vëdh – We will be

Why a vëdh – You will be

Y a vëdh – They will be

Past habitual

Me a vedha – I always used to be

Te a vedha – You always used to be

Ev a vedha – He always used to be

Hy a vedha – She always used to be

Ny a vedha – We always used to be

Why a vedha – You always used to be

Y a vedha – They always used to be

Preterite (past completed)

Me a veu – I was

Te a veu – You were

Ev a veu – He was

Hy a veu – She was

Ny a veu – We were

Why a veu – You were

Y a veu – They were

Conditional

Me a via – I could be

Te a via – You could be

Ev a via – He could be

Hy a via – She could be

Ny a via – We could be

Why a via – You could be

Y a via – They could be

Past subjunctive

Me a ve – I may have been

Te a ve – You may have been

Ev a ve – He may have been

Hy a ve – She may have been

Ny a ve – We may have been

Why a ve – You may have been

Y a ve – They may have been

Present subjunctive

Me a vo – I may be

Te a vo – You may be

Ev a vo – He may be

Hy a vo – She may be

Ny a vo – We may be

Why a vo – You may be

Y a vo – They may be
