ELBOW SURGERY DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS

Diet •	Resume regular diet as tolerated.
Medication •	☐ Follow instructions in your pre op binder for multimodal pain control ☐ Oxycodone ☐ Tylenol #3 ☐ Norco ☐ Aspirin 81 mg: Take 1 tablet for 2 weeks. ☐ You have been given a prescription for Phenergan. Fill this prescription ONLY IF you have severe nausea. • If you had a block, begin taking pain medicine at the first sign of return
	of sensation. Take medicine prior to onset of pain. * Restart your daily medication unless you are instructed to do otherwise.

You will be given a prescription for pain medicine at your preoperative appointment. Take the medicine as needed according to the directions on the bottle. Possible side effects include nausea, dizziness, headache, vomiting, constipation, and urinary retention. If you experience these side effects, please call our office for assistance. Discontinue the medication if you develop a rash, shortness of breath, itching, or difficulty swallowing. If these symptoms become severe you should seek immediate medical attention.

Refills on pain medication are authorized during office hours only (8am-5pm; Mon-Fri.). Medication will not be refilled on weekends.

Activity

- Minimize activity the day of surgery.
- Ice may initially be difficult to apply because of the thick dressings. Apply ice to the elbow 3 times per day for 20 minutes for up to 1 week.
- DO NOT use heat.
- **DO NOT** ACTIVELY (on your own) use your arm until you are instructed to do so.
- **DO NOT** lift anything with your operative hand.
- Open and close your hand 10 times every hour that you are awake.
- **DO NOT** USE exercise equipment unless otherwise instructed.

	You n	may shower 3 days after surgery unless told otherwise. Use a plastic bag or cast cover to protect the sing/cast from getting wet. DO NOT immerse the elbow under water.				
	You m	may NOT shower or get dressings wet until after next office visit.				
Dr	essing re	emoval	:			
	Remove	brace a	nd all dressings 72 hours after surgery. NEVER remove paper tapes (steri-strips) or your fresh gauze and ace wrap. Wrap lightly over the wound. Re-apply the brace.			
		we been given a portable sequential compression device. Wear on both legs when you are not walking ding while sleeping until follow up appointment.				
	DO NO	OT remove the steristrips or zipline until you are seen in our office.

	•	Keep t	he dressing dry.

		If the	dressing does get soaked with wound seepage, remove the dressing and replace with dry gauze			
	If the dressing does get soaked with wound seepage, place an additional bandage over the exist dressing. If you have a splint, you should never remove the splint.					
	•	Dressing removal:				
			Remove all dressings 3 days after the surgery. DO NOT remove the sutures.			
			DO NOT REMOVE the dressings until your next office visit.
