Welcome and Introduction	The Chairman welcomed all in attendance and introduced the evening programme which included an optional visit to the Schoolhouse.	
<u>Chairman's</u> <u>Report</u>	The Chairman noted that the Annual Report and Accounts for the Year to March 31 <sup>st</sup> 2022 had been circulated to all members via email. They had also been posted on the website. In summary: the Chairman explained the impact of pandemic restrictions on the operation of the Hall and noted that that the income of the hall has reduced significantly during the financial period due to COVID restrictions. The Chairman reported that despite the pandemic, the Hall had remained available for use when restrictions allowed. He also was pleased to report that progress had been made on the renovations to the Schoolhouse and thanked all those who had volunteered their support for the work on the garden ground to the rear of the building. Election of Board Members	Chairman briefly explained the role of Trustees and encouraged attendees and others to consider stepping forward as Trustees and members of the Board. Bryan added that we need new members on the committee – people with their own views, opinions, ideas & organisational skills. The Chairman stated that he would not be seeking re-election at the next AGM in 2023. All the existing Board members retired from the Board and offered themselves for re-election.
