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I love the Lord who hears my voice and my pleas for mercy, He leans down when I am in trouble and brings His ear close to me. As long as I have breath, I will call on Him.


I love the Lord who hears my voice.

PRAYING FOR HEALING

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Remember Israel: to live in God's way is to remember God with us, guiding, loving, leading us to love ourselves and others. But life can massage us out of shape; hearts hurt and harden, minds narrow. We forget we live in Love. We turn to lesser things to feel better. Healing comes with remembering that we are wanted and cared for, that God is enough. We are enough. We say the words of The Breastplate to be opened to this healing as we remember:

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, I am surrounded by His Love

Christ where I lie, Christ where I sit, Christ where I arise, Christ in the heart of everyone who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of every one who speaks to me, Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that hears me. I am filled with His Love

Always with me, he brings new love and life each day My heart overflows with his loving kindness Christ in me, my heart, my hands, my hopes. **I am His Love**

Lord, free us from things that do not lead to you, free us to love as you love. When we are wearied by hurt and pain, dogged by fear and insecurity, when we forget who you are and who we are, help us to know that we are wrapped in your arms open our ears to hear your sweet voice telling us that that we are your beloved disciples.

Mark 7 Jesus Heals a Deaf and Mute Man

³¹ Then Jesus left the vicinity of Tyre and went through Sidon, down to the Sea of Galilee and into the region of the Decapolis.^{[h] 32} There some people brought to him a man who was deaf and could hardly talk, and they begged Jesus to place his hand on him.

³³ After he took him aside, away from the crowd, Jesus put his fingers into the man's ears. Then he spit and touched the man's tongue. ³⁴ He looked up to heaven and with a deep sigh said to him, *"Ephphatha!"* (which means "Be opened!"). ³⁵ At this, the man's ears were opened, his tongue was loosened and he began to speak plainly.

³⁶ Jesus commanded them not to tell anyone. But the more he did so, the more they kept talking about it. ³⁷ People were overwhelmed with amazement. "He has done everything well," they said. "He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak."

We spend some time with the God who bends down to be among us – in Jesus.

The same God bends down now, coming into your home, into your heart do that he might listen to you

The invitation is to listen to him

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To speak plainly – whatever that means for you at this time

Imagine the Lord bending down now, listening to places in you that you can't hear: forgotten, overlooked, unwanted, drowned out by the sounds of others. He is listening to it all.

Remember too that Jesus never forces his way in, never forces something out that's not ready to open to his loving attention. You imagine him listening to these places, if that's Ok, or content simply to be with you if it's not. Well.com
