and turned away from my arrogance.

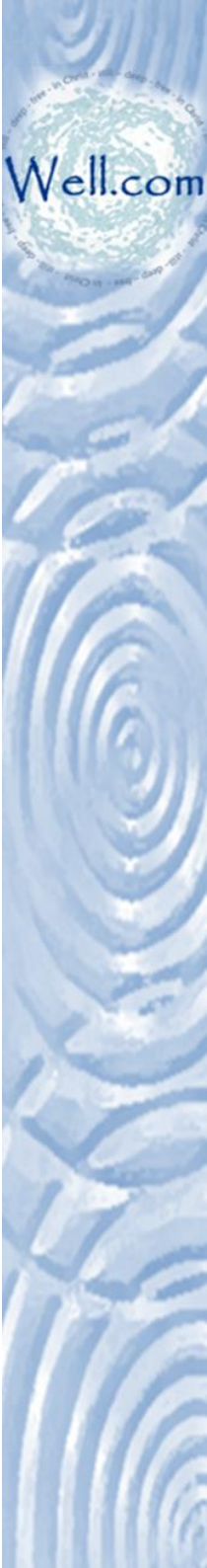
L I am not concerned with great matters

Scripture reading.

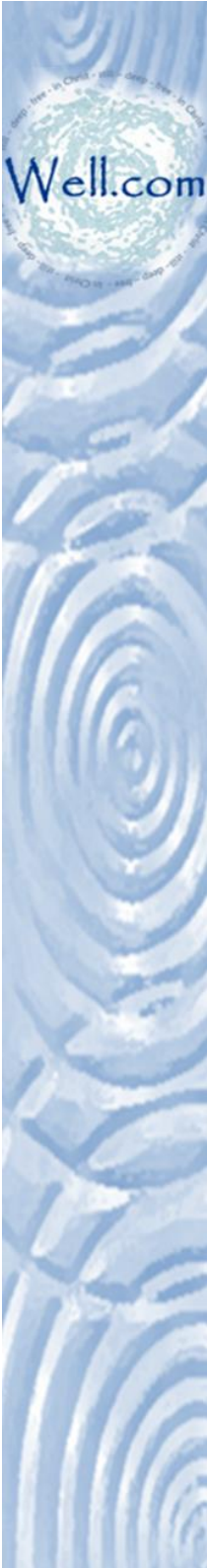

Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer

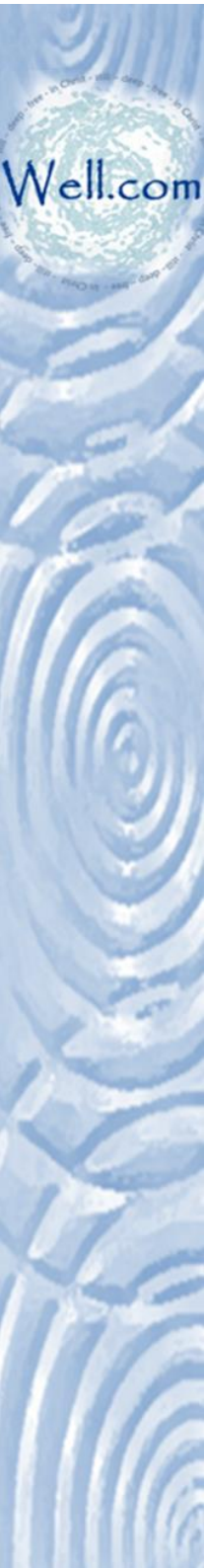
For those who constantly live with poverty and disease in so many parts of the world and for those who work hard to prevent it. **Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer**
