

SUNDAY LITURGY





Welcome

You've joined us in a time of quiet for you and the Lord to enjoy together, in the company of others. You are in your own home and God is there with you. Any questions you hear during this time are intended for you to take into the quiet of your own heart.

We keep mikes on to maintain our connection with each other. However, at particular times you will be asked to mute. As in liturgy, our actions signal something of what God is doing with us. 'Let us mute' is God inviting us to listen carefully.

The longer Gospel for today in the Revised Common Lectionary holds two pieces together, both encouraging respect for the more vulnerable in the society at the time – women and children at a time when they, together with the sick and aged were treated as disposable. Life was cheap. Not for Jesus. He showed each person he met how much he/she was valued and respected, each one precious and irreplaceable in God's kingdom.

We'll reflect on a gospel which captures the essence of today's reading while allowing us a personal experience of how Jesus welcomes us and the parts of ourselves we think are disposable, unwanted, wouldn't be missed ... or that we might wish we could dispose of because we/others don't consider them to be acceptable or attractive.

PRAYING FOR HEALING

Remember Israel: to live in God's way is to remember God with us, guiding, loving, leading us to love ourselves and others. But life can massage us out of shape; hearts hurt and harden, minds narrow. We forget we live in Love. We turn to lesser things to feel better. Healing comes with remembering that we are wanted and cared for, that God is enough. We are enough. We say the words of The Breastplate to be opened to this healing as we remember:

Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left,

Christ where I lie, Christ where I sit, Christ where I arise, Christ in the heart of everyone who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of every one who speaks to me, Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that hears me.

I am filled with His Love

Always with me, he brings new love and life each day My heart overflows with his loving kindness Christ in me, my heart, my hands, my hopes.

I am His Love

Lord, free us from things that do not lead to you, free us to love as you love.

When we are wearied by hurt and pain, dogged by fear and insecurity, when we forget who you are and who we are, help us to know that we are wrapped in your arms open our ears to hear your sweet voice telling us that that we are your beloved disciples.



PRAYING WITH JESUS IN THE GOSPEL

The Lord is here. His Spirit is with us Let us mute

We ask for help to be open to Jesus and his concern for those people who were treated as if they were disposable, unwanted and unimportant. We bring to him those parts of ourselves, those people in our lives who might feel the same. We'll pray with the feeding of the 5000, but don't be fooled by its familiarity. God is always doing something new ... gathering the unwanted, offering care, food, love.



When Jesus got out of the boat, he saw this large crowd, and his heart was filled with pity for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd. So he began to teach them many things. When it was getting late, his disciples came to him and said, "It is already very late, and this is a lonely place. Send the people away, and let them go to the nearby farms and villages in order to buy themselves something to eat."



"You yourselves give them something to eat," Jesus answered.

They asked, "Do you want us to go and spend two hundred silver coins on bread in order to feed them?"

So Jesus asked them, "How much bread do you have? Go and see." When they found out, they told him, "Five loaves and also two fish."

Jesus then told his disciples to make all the people divide into groups and sit down on the green grass. So the people sat down in rows, in groups of a hundred and groups of fifty. Then Jesus took the five loaves and the two fish, looked up to heaven, and gave thanks to God. He broke the loaves and gave them to his disciples to distribute to the people. He also divided the two fish among them all. Everyone ate and had enough.

May we sit humbly before the God who made us


And see him smile


At all of us
