From your Pastor's heart.....

I read the following devotional thought from Adrian Rogers' Love Worth Finding ministries entitled "Your Problems Do Not Have to Be Unconquerable."

Psalm 121:1-2 says, "I will lift up my eyes to the hills, from whence comes my help? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth."

Are you facing problems that seem insurmountable? It may be in your marriage. It may be with your children. It could be at work. Some problems seem larger than any mountain when we face them.

In 1921, British Army officer George Mallory took part in the first expedition to climb Mt. Everest, this

We can conquer. We can grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. We can be filled with the Spirit. Our prayers can increase in power. Submit yourself to God and overcome your Everest.

huge—some thought unconquerable—mountain. They failed. Mallory made a second attempt in 1922 and his last one in 1924. They got to 25,000 ft. No one is sure what happened, but Mallory and a friend slipped and fell—and died on the slopes of Mt. Everest. Soon another group failed in tragedy.

Years later in London, a man was giving a speech on how hard Everest was to conquer. Behind him, a huge photograph of Everest covered the wall. Then he turned around and started talking to Mount Everest: "Everest, we tried once to conquer you, and we failed. We tried again to conquer you, and we failed. But, Everest, we will conquer you, because you can't grow any bigger, but we can, we can."

Churches can deliver backpacks in boxes to Central KY location at Rosemont Baptist Church, 556 Rosemont Garden, Lex., KY. Chris Mofield, 859-254-7747, office@cknb.org.

Each church must:

Ensure that each backpack is packed with toys, clothing, food items, & a copy of the "Christmas Story" leaflet.

- Ensure that each backpack has 2 color-coded ribbons specifying the age and gender of its contents.
- Determine the gender and age for the backpacks, then tie two ribbons on each backpack to designate following the color chart below:

 Blue Boys

 Pink Girls

Purple - Ages 2-3 Yellow - Ages 4-7 Green - Ages 8-10

Red - Ages 11-14 White - Ages 15-17

- Pack four to six backpacks each in a medium to large (approximately 18"x18"x16") cardboard boxes (available at Lowes, Home Depot, Staples, etc.). PLEASE, keep those designated for the same ages and genders together when possible.
- Write with a marker on the outside of each cardboard box how many backpacks & for what gender are enclosed (Ex: B-2, G-2).

Transport the committed number of backpacks to the designated associational collection site.
