SERVE OTHERS

A few years ago, I preached on the biblical truth and need to "Serve Others!" As I began to think about my article this week, I again was reminded of the importance of serving and the impact it has in our daily relationships and in our relationship to God.

Throughout scripture, believers are encouraged, perhaps even commanded, to serve others. Why is this so important? Perhaps it is because we need to learn to have the Christ like attribute of compassion for those around us. At the same time, as we care for those around us, we are in turn assisting God in his work.

When we serve others, we are also serving God. A scripture found in the New Testament declares, "...
