
WHEW

It seems modern advertising tactics have decided to run most TV ads repeatedly, hour after hour, day after day, week after week, ad nauseum! Maybe the idea is that after hearing an ad for the hundredth time, you will have it burned into your brain and it will play back when you hear the first words or musical note. Not being a fan of commercials on TV, I can only assume the worst. My philosophy is to do something else while these ads run, but I still must listen to them even if I am reading my Daily Devotional, a book or setting the table for our next meal. However, that said, I watched one particular commercial recently which reminded me of our Christian duty.

The ad was for a major auto insurance company. I had seen many of their ads before, but this one has the spokesperson and



his sidekick, an Emu, telling a driver about the benefits of their insurance for autos. Only this time the driver was taking his car through the automatic car wash! We see the spokesperson and his sidekick continue their spiel all the way through the car washing. We see them at the exit all wet and covered with soap suds. The spokesperson has a classic final statement, "Whew! We gotta go again!"



Wouldn't it be great if we took our witnessing to that level of enthusiasm? What if we witnessed to a friend, neighbor, fellow worker, or a new acquaintance who is not yet a Christian? If we did so with this kind of enthusiasm, maybe they could understand how important such information is, such as the gift of eternal life in Jesus. In many cases, we may witness without ever knowing whether the person comes to believe the truth, but God only asks us to "plant some seeds". The results are in His hands. However, there will be times when we do get to see the results and someone previously in the "lost" category comes into the love and life of Christ! We certainly celebrate with them when that happens because we have been a part of God's redeeming work.

Matthew 28:18-20 reads, "And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." With that kind of promise, it doesn't matter whether we see the person coming to salvation or not. We should remain enthusiastic, saying, "Whew. Gotta go again!"
