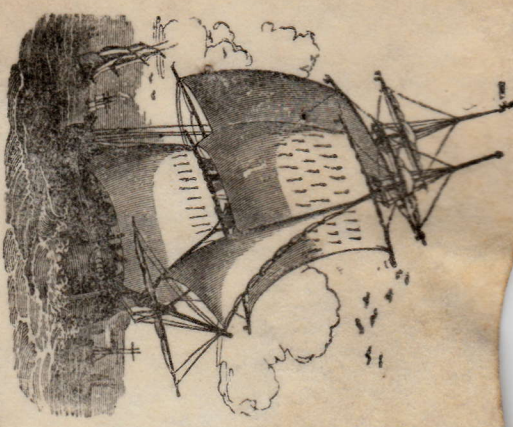

BETWEEN Thomas Wickenden of Whitby, Gent, Son of

years, that the said Thomas Wickenden with him, his executors, and administrators, after the manner of put and bound himself apprentice unto the said Thomas Wickenden for and during, and unto the full end and term of years, from thence next

from the first day of March next, for and during, and unto the full end and term of years, from thence next during all which term, the said apprentice his said master will well and faithfully serve, his secrets keep, his lawful commands everywhere do and execute; hurt or damage to, or allow to be done by others, but, to the utmost of his power, will hinder the same, and, forthwith, his said master thereof warn; taverns or alehouses I

master's business; at dice, cards, tables, bowls, or any unlawful games, he will not play; the goods of his said master he will not embezzle, or waste, or lend, or give master's licence; matrimony during the said term he will not contract; nor, from the service of his said master, without his consent, at any time, absent himself; and demean and behave himself towards his master, his family, executors, or administrators, during the said term; and true and just accounts of his said master's goods, charge, or which shall come into his hands, faithfully he will give, at all times, when thereunto required by his said master, his executors or administrators; and truly pay, or cause to be paid unto his said master, his executors, or administrators, all such wages, prize money, and other sum or sums of money, as shall be

the circumstance thereunto belonging; and shall and will find and provide for the said apprentice sufficient meat, drink, and lodging; and to pay unto him the sum of yearly, during the said term, in lieu of washing; and also pay unto him the sum of thirty-two POUNDS, of lawful money, current in Great Britain
for the first year of the said term six pounds; for the second

year eight pounds; for the third year of the said term ten pounds
for the fourth and last year of the said term ten pounds
for the fourth and last year of the said term ten pounds

the said Thomas Wickenden finding and providing himself with all manner of sea-bedding, wearing apparel, and other necessaries. And it is covenanted, assigned, sold, released, confirmed, warranted, and confirmed, that the said Thomas Wickenden, his executors, or administrators, shall and may, from time to time, during the said term, deduct and retain mentioned, all such sum or sums of money as he or they shall at any time during the said term disburse or lay out in the buying of any apparel, sea-bedding, or other things

AND, for the true performance of all and singular the covenants and agreements aforesaid, each of them, the said Thomas Wickenden doth hereby bind and obligate himself, his heirs, executors, and administrators, unto the value of the penal sum of One Hundred Pounds, of lawful money, current in Great Britain, firmly by these presents.

THIS INDENTURE

the *Fourth* Year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lady VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND

QUEEN, Defender of the Faith, and in the Year of Our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred and *forty* five

BETWEEN *Thomas Wickenden of Wandsworth, Paragon Street, in the Parish of St. George's, in the County of Surrey, of the one Part,*

and *Thomas Wickenden of Walling, New Layer's Place, in the Parish of St. Andrew's, in the County of Middlesex, of the other Part,*

Thomas Wickenden the said *Thomas Wickenden* hath, of his free will,

put and lodged himself apprentice unto the said *Thomas Wickenden* with him, his executors, and administrators, after the manner of an apprentice, to dwell, remain, and serve,

from the *first day of October* for and during, and unto the full end and term of *four* years, from thence next ensuing, fully to be complete and ended;

during all which term, the said apprentice his said master will well and faithfully serve, his secrets keep, his lawful commands everywhere do and execute; hurt or damage to his said master he will not do,

consent to, or allow to be done by others, but, to the utmost of his power, will hinder the same, and, forthwith, his said master thereof warn; taverns or alehouses he will not frequent, unless about his said

master's business; at dice, cards, tables, bowls, or any unlawful games, he will not play; the goods of his said master he will not embroil, or waste, or lend, or give to any person or persons, without his said

master's license; matrimony during the said term he will not contract; nor, from the service of his said master, without his consent, at any time, absent himself; but, as a true and faithful apprentice, will

demean and behave himself towards his master, his family, executors, or administrators, during the said term; and true and just accounts of his said master's goods, chattels, and money committed to his

charge, or which shall come into his hands, faithfully he will give, at all times, when thereunto required by his said master, his executors or administrators; and will also render an account of, and well and

truly pay, or cause to be paid unto his said master, his executors, or administrators, all such wages, prize money, and other sum or sums of money, as shall become due and payable unto him from Her

Majesty, her heirs, or successors or any other person, in case he shall be impressed, enter or go into Her Majesty's service, or any other service, during the said term.

IN CONSIDERATION WHEREOF, the said *Thomas Wickenden* doth hereby covenant, promise, and agree, to and with the

said *Thomas Wickenden* the apprentice, that the said *Thomas Wickenden* doth hereby covenant, promise, and agree, to and with the

administrators, or assigns, shall and will teach, learn, and inform him, the said apprentice, or cause him to be taught, learned, and informed in the art, trade, or business of a MARINER, or SEAMAN, with

the attendance thereunto belonging; and shall and will find and provide for the said apprentice sufficient meat, drink, and lodging; and to pay unto him the sum of *one* shillings

yearly, during the said term, in lieu of washing; and also pay unto him the sum of *three* POUNDS, of lawful money, current in Great Britain, in manner following (that is to say) —

one pound for the first year of the said term; *two* pounds for the second year of the said term; and *one* pound for the third year of the said term; and *one* pound for the fourth and last year of the said term; *one* pound for the fifth year of the said term; *one* pound for the sixth year of the said term; *one* pound for the seventh year of the said term; and *one* pound for the eighth year of the said term.

And it is hereby agreed between the said parties, that the said *Thomas Wickenden* his executors, or administrators, shall and may, from time to time, during the said term, deduct and retain, out of the several yearly payments above-

mentioned, all such sum or sums of money as he or they shall at any time during the said term disburse or lay out in the buying of any apparel, non-bedding, or other necessaries for the apprentice, as need

shall require.

AND, for the true performance of all and singular the covenants and agreements aforesaid, each of them, the said *Thomas Wickenden* and *Thomas Wickenden* doth hereby bind and oblige himself, his heirs, executors, and administrators, unto the *sever* of them, his executors, and administrators, in the

penal sum of One Hundred Pounds, of lawful money, current in Great Britain, firmly by these presents.
