Venue

ICHNIA 2020 will be held on October 26-30, 2020, in Florianópolis, Santa Catarina State, southern Brazil, in the *Canto da Ilha Hotel and Convention Center*. The *Canto da Ilha Hotel* is a perfect place for ICHNIA 2020 as it provides single, double, and triple-based accommodation and has a good infrastructure of rooms and auditoriums for the meeting activities. It also counts with a pool area for relaxing and two soccer courts for our traditional ICHNIA Soccer Game. The hotel is surrounded by hills covered by the Mata Atlântica Rain Forest ecosystem and is 200 m from Ponta das Canas Beach. A natural mangrove strip extends in the backshore zone allowing observation of crabs in burrowing activity.

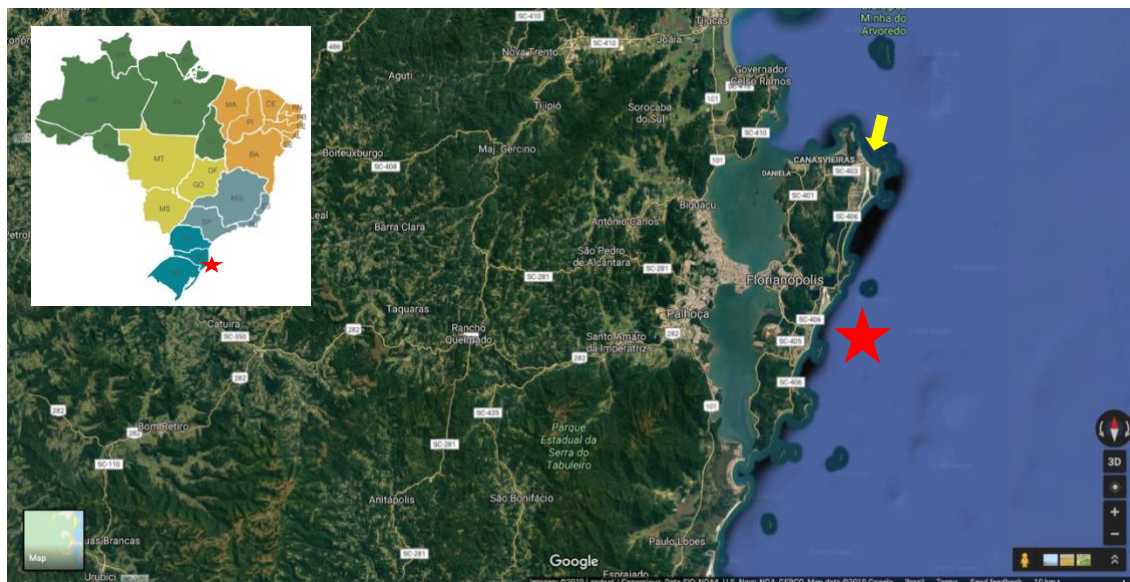
Accommodation

Scientific activities

1. Technical sessions and keynote talks

The technical sessions will occur on October 26, 27, 29, and 30 and will include oral and poster sessions, as well as keynote talks. The technical sessions are open for contributions that discuss any topic of interest of Ichnology and will encompass four major themes: (paleo)biology, (paleo)ecology, (paleo)environmental reconstruction and stratigraphy, and new frontiers in Ichnology. The keynote talks will also consider these four major themes and will represent the diversity of thematic groups that compose the ichnological community.

- Dr. Charles Savrda, Auburn University (U.S.A.), *"Bioerosion of lithic substrates in freshwater aquatic settings: a poorly explored but potentially fertile aspect of continental ichnology"*.
- Dr. Koji Seike, Geological Survey of Japan, National Institute of Advanced Industrial Science and Technology (Japan), *"Neoichnology on marine deposits – beaches, shorefaces, and deep-sea floors"*.
- Dr. Anthony Martin, Emory University (U.S.A.), *"Popular Ichnology: toward a public awareness of our science"*.

3. Field excursions

FT_1 – Continental Ichnology of the Botucatu Formation (Pre-congress field trip)

The Cretaceous deposits of the Botucatu Formation contain a considerable record of vertebrate footprints, including dinosaurs and early mammals, and also arthropod trackways. Giuseppe Leonardi originally studied part of these occurrences since 1977 and registered it in his “Annotated Atlas of South America Tetrapod Footprints (Devonian to Holocene) with an appendix on Mexico and Central America.” In this 3-day tour, the participants will be guided by the sidewalks of Araraquara and São Carlos cities to see beautiful trace fossils preserved in the sandstone slabs used as pavement. Specimens of *Brasilichinum elusivum* and fascinating dinosaur tracks and trackways, as well as *Taenidium* and arthropod trackways and burrows, can be seen in this tour. A visit to local collections to see selected specimens and a tentative visit to a Botucatu sandstone quarry is also planned.

When: October 21-23, 2020

Departure from: Ribeirão Preto Airport (São Paulo State).

Estimated fee: R\$ 1.320,00 (Brazilian Real). The fee includes transportation from/to Ribeirão Preto Airport, hotel accommodation (double-based), a field-trip guide, refreshments, and meals.

Minimum/maximum of participants: 17/40

Fees do not include air tickets, thus be aware that your flight to Florianópolis includes a stopover in Ribeirão Preto Airport.

FT_2 – The ichnology of subtropical Atlantic beaches (Intra-congress field trip)

Neoichnology is the scope of the intra-congress field trip when we will explore the biogenic structures currently made in some Florianópolis beaches, including backshore dunes, ephemeral lagoons, and subtropical mangrove (= restinga) margins. This field trip is open to all registered participants and is covered by the congress fees.

Please select FT_2 in the registration form if you plan to attend to let us know how many seats we will need for bus transportation.

FT_3 – Invertebrate trace fossils from Southern Brazil (Post-congress field trip)

The Paleozoic deposits of the Paraná Basin are rich in invertebrate trace fossils. They will be the focus of this 4-days tour post-congress field trip, and the participants will be guided to see the Brazilian occurrence of *Cruziana acacensis* used by Dolf Seilacher to calibrate the Silurian ichnostratigraphy. The localities of the Devonian crowded *Rosselia* ichnofabric, and the 'Zoophycos carnival' will also be visited, besides other areas with a rich Lower Paleozoic *Cruziana* Ichnofacies assemblage. You will also visit a few siltstone quarries rich in Gondwanan glacial trace fossil and plenty of microbially induced sedimentary structures (MISS). Localities with the post-glacial trace fossil assemblage will also be visited to see the impoverished marginal-marine and shallow marine trace fossil suites that followed a post-glacial marine transgression.

Departing from: Canto da Ilha Hotel, Florianópolis, SC

Estimated fee: R\$ 1.760,00 (Brazilian Real). The price includes transportation from the Canto da Ilha Hotel/to Hercilio Luz International Airport, in Florianópolis, hotel accommodation (double-based), a field-trip guide, refreshments, and meals.

Minimum/Maximum of participants: 10/20

FT_4 – Dinosaur trackways from Sousa Basin (Post-congress field trip)

This field trip will visit the Rio do Peixe Valley region in Northeastern Brazil, where several basins can be accessed. Many of these basins contain a prolific continental ichnological record, as is the case of the well-known Sousa Basin, widely explored by Giuseppe Leonardi between the years of 1970 and 1980. Hundreds of dinosaur tracks are known in the region, including the holotypes of *Caririchnium magnificum* Leonardi, 1984, *Sousaichnium pricei* Leonardi, 1979, and *Moraesichnium barberenae* Leonardi, 1979. Also, crocodiles, chelonians, and many invertebrate traces can be observed in the fluvio-lacustrine geological context of the region. This tour will last four days, starting at Juazeiro do Norte (CE) Airport, and will continue to Sousa by land (PB). Participants will have the chance to know the landscapes of the northeastern Brazilian outback, the 'sertanejo' way of life, and experience the regional food.

When: October 31 – November 3, 2020

Departing from: Hercilio Luz International Airport in Florianópolis to Juazeiro do Norte Airport (air-ticket not included in the field trip costs), and then travel by bus.

Estimated fee: R\$ 1.870,00 (Brazilian Real). The price includes transportation from/to the Juazeiro do Norte Airport, hotel accommodation (double-based) during field trip, a field-trip guide, refreshments, and meals.

Fees do not include air tickets, thus be aware of including the flight from Florianópolis to Juazeiro do Norte Airport (JDO) (Ceará State) in your flight itinerary. We strongly recommend that participants take a late afternoon flight to Juazeiro do Norte on October 30th and spend the night in a local hotel. The cost of this accommodation is not included in the field trip fee. The field trip leaders are looking for the best options for accommodation in Juazeiro do Norte. This information will be updated on ICHNIA 2020 website as soon as they are available.

Registration

Registration in ICHNIA 2020 will be open on January 15, 2020 and considers three main categories: student (including post-doc), professional, and companion. IIA members will have a 20% discount for two years of membership (2019-2020) and 10% for one year of membership (2020). Members of SEPM, IAS, AGU, The Paleontological Society, AWG (Association of Women in Geosciences), and SBP (The Brazilian Paleontological Society) will have a 10% discount (same values as IIA 1-year membership).

The registration fee includes all ICHNIA 2020 materials, access to the technical sessions and keynote talks, all coffee breaks and lunch meals, access to a co-working area, transportation and meals during the intra-congress field trip, and the ice-break party. The registration fee does not include accommodation, dinner meals, alcoholic drinks during lunch meals, field trips, workshops, and short courses. Companion fees include all coffee breaks and lunch meals, access to a co-working area, transportation and meals during the intra-congress field trip, and the ice-break party. Workshop and short course fees include access to the activity, coffee breaks, and materials provided by leaders (digital format).

Abstract Submission

The Scientific Committee is pleased to invite authors to submit their abstracts of original contributions to the field of Ichnology and related areas for oral and poster presentations to be delivered at ICHNIA 2020.

Guidelines for the Abstract Structure:

Abstracts must be written in Times New Roman 12 pt and may include figures (maximum 2), tables (maximum 1), and references, considering up to three pages in extension. The text (including figures and tables) should be justified.

- 1. Title of presentation:** Please choose a brief, non-descriptive title that clearly indicates the content of the contribution.
- 2. Authors:** Please include name and surname only; middle names should be indicated by the initials only.
- 3. Affiliation:** Please include only the institution name and e-mail address. Superscript numbers should indicate different affiliations.
- 4. Text:** The text must contain a short introduction highlighting the scientific problem, the objectives of the contribution, and the study novelty. Then, describe how the study was conducted, including a short geological setting. After that, describe the results with discussions, presenting the main conclusions (or final remarks). The citations must be numbered with the format [1] by order of appearance and listed at the end of the text. Abbreviations may be used in the text if they are defined when first used.
- 5. Figures and tables:** Figures should be presented in colors and might have enough print quality (minimum 300 dpi). It must be inserted in the text, as well as tables. The tables should be formatted as clean as possible. The abstracts will be available on the ICHNIA 2020 website, and tables can lose format when inserted in the webpage.
- 6. Reference list:** Please, follow the form below:

How to Submit your Abstract:

After finishing your abstract, save it in a Word file tagged with the authors' name, as indicated below. If you are submitting more than one contribution, include numbers at the end of the file tag to differentiate the files. Include in the tag the wished type of presentation (oral or poster).

Examples:

- Smith_oral.docx - in the case of a unique author
- Smith&Jones_poster.docx - in the case of two authors
- Smith_et al_oral_1.docx - in the case of three or more authors

In search to promote the **One Ichnology!** philosophy, ICHNIA prefers not to offer parallel sessions. Thus, the number of oral presentations is limited to ~80, but poster presentations are unlimited. Authors are free to submit as many abstracts for oral presentation as they desire, but there is no guarantee that they will be accepted in this format. The final decision about oral or poster presentation is taken by the Scientific Committee, based on the following criteria: overall scientific impact, the novelty of the contribution, and data and conclusions robustness. The Scientific Committee may use additional criteria. Be aware of this when preparing your contributions!

ICHNIA 2020 Special Publications

The Latin American Journal of Sedimentology and Basin Analysis (LAJSBA) will dedicate a Special Issue to ICHNIA 2020, edited by Dr. Sebastian Richiano (CONICET, Argentina). LAJSBA is an international journal published by the Argentinean Association of Sedimentology with more than 25 years of history publishing papers related to the broad spectrum of sedimentological topics. LAJSBA it is a full open-access journal, and is indexed, among others, by Scopus and Scimago.

For this Special Issue we will receive papers proposals up to 1st March of 2020, and the deadline for submission is 1st July 2020. The purpose of these deadlines is that most of the papers are already published online for the beginning of the ICHNIA 2020. Contributions related to the role of ichnology to decipher environmental aspects of sedimentary successions all around the world are welcome!

Social events

As science is not everything in life, a little fun also does well. Touristic assistance will also be offered during the meeting for those interested in exploring Florianópolis and its beautiful beaches or extending the stay to visit other places in Brazil.

Conveniences

Florianópolis is a big island, the distance between other hotels and the congress headquarters may be considerable, and the traffic on the island is heavy during rush hours. Also, the frequency of public transportation to the Ponta das Canas Beach is low, and most of the taxi drivers do not speak English (the same is true for restaurants and services, unfortunately!). Stay in another hotel might imply arriving late in the congress activities or be at risk for not being able to communicate in your way to the congress. Thus, for safety and logistic reasons, it is strongly recommended that all participants stay in Canto da Ilha Hotel.

Meals and conveniences

Lunch will be provided by ICHNIA 2020 at the hotel. For dinner, the restaurant at the hotel will offer a salad bar and a choice of hot menu for those that prefer to do not leave the hotel. There are some choices of bars and restaurants in a ray of 2 km from the hotel for those that prefer to go outside for dinner. Suggestions about the gastronomy and attractions on the island will be provided daily by the Organizing Team.

A few convenience stores, as well as pharmacy, mini-market, and gas station, can also be reached in the surroundings of the hotel.

Arriving in Florianópolis

There are three ways to arrive in Florianópolis: by car, by bus, or by plane. Those that will arrive by car must be aware that all traffic information is provided in Portuguese. If you are not able to understand it, bus or plane should be the best choices. You must be aware also to the speed limits, as the main road (BR-101 Road) that arrives in Florianópolis is full of speed controllers and the fines are expensive! There is only one bus terminal and one airport in Florianópolis, so all buses and flights arrive in the same respective place. For now, ICHNIA 2020 will provide transfers airport/hotel/airport but will have people in the Hercílio Luz Airport (Florianópolis) to assist the participants with transfer options. If this situation change you will be informed before your arrival.

Brazilian currency

Brazilian Real (BRL or R\$) is the official currency in Brazil. Foreign currencies are not accepted in almost all places, so you need to have cash in Brazilian Reals. US Dollars and Euros (and traveler checks) can be exchanged in almost all exchange money shops, but they are far from the hotel. Thus, the best option is to change some amount of money at the airport when arriving and use an international credit or debit card.

Visit visa (VIVIS) and vaccination requirements

Please, check carefully if you are eligible for visiting Brazil without a visa, and if you need a particular type of visa to come for a congress **before** planning your trip. Detailed information, can be obtained at https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Visa_policy_of_Brazil#Visa_policy_map. The Secretary will be able to send an invitation letter by request, if necessary – ask at secretary@ichnia2020.com.

Yellow Fever and Measles have re-appeared in some areas in Brazil. Vaccination is not mandatory, but strongly recommended. Be aware that you need to be immunized at least 10 days before your trip for Yellow Fever and maybe two months for Measles. Also, there are some tropical diseases that are transmitted by mosquitoes (Dengue, Zika, and Chikungunya fevers). Be aware to use insect repellent during the day (*Aedes aegypti* bites mostly during the morning or the evening).

Health insurance, medication, dietary restrictions

The Brazilian public health service will provide any assistance that you need without charge, but you will have to wait many hours to be attended. Thus, it is strongly recommended that you

travel with health insurance. Bring all the medication of permanent use and also those specific medicines that you must have for an emergency. Do not forget to bring the recipes, preferentially with the generic name of the active substance, in the case that you need to buy an extra supply. Dietary restrictions, as well as chronic diseases and allergies, must be informed in the subscription form.
