Current Status

Overview:

In 2022 the 1st team were relegated from Southern Premier League Division 3 and will play in Hampshire Cricket League Div 1 whilst the 2nd team will play in Hampshire County 4 South. The 3rd & 4th teams both play in Division 5 West.

2022 sees the new captain take leadership of the 1st, 3rd and 4th teams. We see our 3rd and 4th team as a chance to develop young players and strive to have a mixture of youth and experience within these teams. This is also the philosophy of the Sunday team including being founder members of the Tony Woodhouse Trophy which is run every year between three clubs.

Hythe and Dibden Ladies Cricket team continue to play in Hampshire W10 initiative including participating in the W10 indoor league, league festivals and one off festivals. The team is struggling for players but are keen to play and will continue to recruit.

We have 4 colts teams for 2022 and will be running both All Stars and Dynamo's. All Stars have been running for several years now and have been very successful in attracting new players and families to the club. We delivered the Dynamo's programme for the first time in 2021 and had 8 participants. 6 of these were out of the area and even though they attended all the sessions we haven't seen them join our winter colt sessions.

The club has a large and very active social membership and is key members of community events such as Hythe Village Fete and Hythe Community Fireworks which are held annually. The club is in a stable financial position.

During the winter months the club hosts Hythe Aztecs which is a local football team and enters a darts league. This helps bolster the club's funds during the winter

months. Alongside these regular events we hold fundraising and social events throughout the year.

The club has a strong committee of hard-working volunteers. We have a new Chairman for 2022. The outgoing Chairman will take on the role as Vice Chairman and will be available to support the incoming Chairman. We would like to create a fundraising committee this year to focus on raising funds for the club to redevelop the club house and improve our facilities. We also need someone to seek new and additional sponsorship.

There are currently no issues with the administration and management of the social side of the club. Regular committee meetings are held to review the current position and manage any necessary actions.
