## NATIONAL PROGRAMMES ACTIVATOR CODE OF CONDUCT



- Make sure you and the children have fun
- Introduce yourself as the activator at the start of the sessions and, where
  possible, welcome the children by name when they arrive
- Display high standards in use of language, manner, punctuality, preparation and presentation
- Make sure you have enough activators or parent helpers to run the session safely, with at least one adult per 8 children
- Always treat individuals with respect and challenge any discrimination you see
- Communicate with, and provide feedback to, children in a way that reflects respect and care (remember what you say and what they hear may be two different things)
- Promote good practice and challenge any poor practice. By Practice we mean the way people act and behave around children
- Be aware of the physical needs of the children and ensure that the activity is appropriate and in line with the curriculums of the relevant National Programme. (Any specific needs will be identified on child registration and activators will be able to access support in this area through their Activator training)
- Ensure that physical contact is appropriate, necessary and is carried out with the child's full consent and approval)
- Use the All Stars Cricket and Dynamos cricket equipment and do not allow children to use inappropriate equipment such as hard balls and adult sized bats
- Be a friendly and approachable individual
- Inform parents/guardians immedialy if you are concerned about the welfare of a child, unless the concerns are about the parent/guardian.
- Use the "Safe Hands" Reporting procedures if you have a concern Share it with your club welfare officer.
- Not taking action is not acceptable
