Mayor Bailey opened the March 16, 2021 virtual Zoom Council meeting at 7:00pm with a prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Roll Call: Present at the regular meeting of Council were Rahe, Angel, Jacobs, Long, and Madaras. Others present were, Bob Kuhlman, Eric Campbell, Ed Wozniak, Gene Steele, and the Clerk.

Minutes: Rahe moved and Long seconded to approve the minutes from the March 2, 2021, meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Council Reports:

Rahe:

<u>Streets & Sidewalk</u>: Rahe stated the Street Committee met on the 10th. Rahe stated they will try and assess some of the sidewalks within the Village.

<u>Lands & Building</u>: Rahe stated Lands and Building met Monday and discussed the estimates for a new roof and gutters at the pool. Rahe stated the door at the pool has been fixed.

Discussed opening the public restrooms. It was determined that the cleaning gal will clean the public restrooms three times a week. Rahe will discuss with the guys about wiping down the door handles daily.

Angel:

Absent.

Jacobs:

<u>Park and Recreation:</u> Jacobs stated Park and Rec met and discussed the pool. Jacobs stated the individual interested in the pool manager last year has been hired as pool manger this year. Jacobs stated opening day for the pool is May 29th, they will close Tuesday through Friday due to school still in session, but will reopen on Saturday with full hours. Jacobs stated the committee discussed various items needed for the pool such as a sound system and a vacuum. It was mentioned using the money donated from Opelt's estate however, Mayor stated the money from the estate will be used towards something more permanent to honor Mr. Opelt.

Jacobs stated it was discussed that with the potential relocation of the water tower, the basketball court would need to be relocated as well. It was discussed that the most suitable location would to move towards the shelter house.

Long:

Planninig Commission: Long stated there is a Planning Commission meeting tomorrow evening at 7pm.

<u>BPA:</u> Long stated BPA discussed the waterline extension at the Smith easement. Long stated the lowest bid was for \$28,000 and the board approved to move forward with Palmers.

Madaras:

Madaras stated he was looking for an update on the progess of the list of trees that were removed and would need attention in the spring with soil and grass seed. Rahe stated she was not aware and would check with the Street department.

Mayor:

Mayor stated she received a check for the pool and the police department in the amount of \$50,000 each from Opelt's estate. Mayor stated the Village will recived a smaller check once everything is finalized in the estate.

Mayor stated that the is a collection taking place to purchase a bench for downtown in honor of Mike Cox AKA "Goober".

Mayor discussed having Council begin hybrid meeting starting with the May 4th meeting. Mayor stated the girls will be back in the office beginning Monday April 5th.

Mayor stated she signed up for Sourcewell which allows for lower pricing.
