President's Corner

What a thrill to finally see the first of our new badges! You may be wondering why it has taken so long after we chose our badge design to start receiving them. It

did take longer than anticipated to work out many details including the size of our badge to accommodate for club and personal names, the exact placement of the soles to allow for swingers and various engraving issues. On January 21, I ordered 25 additional badges which consist of those whose dues were received and who asked for first names only and a magnet badge. As soon as they come in I will give them out at classes and then at our Mike Sikorsky dance on February 9. At our next board meeting we will be talking about swingers and several choices we need to make now that we are all together.

Now that we know each other better, I would like to share something personal with you. Do you ever wonder why I insist on sitting with a back support? Or question why as a president, I don't greet people more as they enter a dance or stand and visit after a square? I really wish I could. It is both something I believe to be important, and that I would love to do. The truth is, if I did that, I would be in too much pain to dance. Square dancing is one of my passions and thus the reason that I work as hard as I do for our club. At age 55, recently divorced, with a 7 year old son, Drew, I became severely ill with an auto immune illness that was supposed to be chronic, progressive and degenerative called Polymiositis. The primary symptom of the illness is that all the muscle cells of the body are attacked, and most of mine were destroyed. I walked bent over at the waist since it was impossible for me to straighten my body. It would take me over 45 minutes to get out of bed in the morning. One day I ended up on my garage floor alone; it took me one and a half hours while using my car for support, to stand up. I was desperate to make it into our home before my son was dropped off from a play date. Long story short, I was told by a few rheumatologists that the most that could be done was

to slow down the progression of the illness. I'm so grateful that through a lot of work and with the help of many wonderful healers, we were able to stop the illness and I continue to get stronger with each year. However if I stand, walk or sit without back support, I fatigue rapidly. When I dance, the endorphins help me to by-pass all pain, so please understand when I give my place to another dancer at a class or at a dance, I am NOT doing it because I want to sit out.

Now to a message you probably feel you hear from me too often. We all need to make sure no student or visitor is ever sitting out and no one is sitting out more than once during the evening, unless it is by choice. So please be mindful, and do volunteer your spot in a square once a night.

David Mee, Mike Seastrom, and Mike Sikorsky are just a few of the callers who have mentioned to me how impressed they are with the merger of our clubs. They have pointed out how most of the clubs that try to merge do not succeed. I want to honor each and every one of you for making this amazing merger a reality.

Having a strong turnout means that we can have four or even five squares for the mainstream class. And many of our Angels have made the extra effort to stay for the Plus class, allowing us to have at least two or three squares. Bill has been calling a lively dance and both classes are moving right along. By week three, the Mainstream class was already dancing 29 different Basic calls and the Plus class had covered 7 of the 28 Plus calls.

Our Angels are doing a great job, not just filling out the squares when we dance, but also taking the time to make our new students feel welcomed. Thank you all! I'm especially grateful to those who arrive in time to "square up" promptly at 7:15. Our new system of assigning students to squares works best when we can start right out with four squares.

As always with square dancing, our number one objective is to have a good time dancing. Please let me know if you have any questions or suggestions for how to make the class better.

Line dancing starts at 7:00 PM, the Basic/Mainstream class will "square up" promptly at 7:15, and the Plus class starts at 8:45.
