1.	Course Code: PSYC101	Course Title: Introduction to Psychology I
	It provides an objective and scientific approach to the study of human behavior. Course topics include scientific methods of research in psychology, biology and behavior, sensation and perception, learning and cognition, and developmental and social psychology.	
2.	Course Code: PHIL101	Course Title: Introduction to Philosophy
	Birth of Philosophy, Philosophical Disciplines, History of Science, Epistemology, Philosophy of Science, Kuhn's Criticism on History and Philosophy, Philosophy of Social Sciences, Discrimination of Natural-Social Sciences, The Birth of Modern Philosophy, The Disciplines of Modern Philosophy, Social Sciences in point of view of History of Science, Culture, Modernity, Postmodernity, Foucault's Critique of Modernity.	
3.	Course Code: SOCI101	Course Title: Introduction to Sociology
	Students explore the concepts and theories necessary to systematic understanding of our social worlds. Topics may include considering sociology as science, the nature of large- and small-scale groups, social stratification, historical eras and social change, and race, ethnic and gender relations.	
4.	Course Code: TURK111	Course Title: Turkish I: Written Communication
	Language, its definition and importance. Language and culture relations. Written language and its characteristics. Written expression; comprehension and punctuation rules. Planning in writing, theme, perspective, identifying mistakes and applying corrections. Types of literature (anecdote, novel criticism etc.) and formality. Types of written expression, colloquial, literary, scientific, official language; criticism; researching and using sources; classroom exercises and discussion concerning all the subjects.	
5.	Course Code: AITT101	Course Title: Principles of Atatürk and History of Revolution I ¹

7.	Course Code: ENGL101	Course Title: English I
	This is a first-semester EAP course for freshman students, and it focuses on developing both receptive and productive skills as well as the study skills required for university-level coursework.	
8.	Course Code: PSYC102	Course Title: Introduction to Psychology II
	Continuation of PSYC 101. This course will serve as an overview of general principles, concepts, and facts about human behavior and Students have the opportunity to learn about a range of areas including intelligence, motivation, gender, development, personality, health psychology and social psychology.	
9.	Course Code: PSYC104	Course Title: Statistics I
	Collecting, organizing, and summarizing data,.descriptive statistics, sampling, sampling size estimation, hypothesis testing will be the focus of the course.	
10.	Course Code: PSYC106	Course Title: Literature Review and Report Writing in Psychology
	Science and features of scientific knowledge research process and stages format of a scientific paper: APA manual for manuscript. Format of a scientific paper: cover, index, tables list, figures list, main part: text the principles and the rules of using and citing resources in text. The principles and the rules of using and citing resources in text. The principles and the rules of using and citing resources in text. 12.	Course Code: AITT102	Course Title: Principles of Atatürk and History of Revolution II ²

14.	Course Code: ENGL102	Course Title: English II
	This course is continuation of ENGL 101- English I. It involves further development of students' EAP oral and written communication skills as well as further development of the study skills essential to success at this level.

15.	Course Code: PSYC201	Course Title: Developmental Psychology I
	This course is designed for psychology majors and as such aims to emphasize on developmental study of human from birth to death including childhood, adolescent and adulthood terms. Emphasis on the influence of genetic, physical, cognitive, emotional, familial, moral, educational, cultural and social factors.	
16.	Course Code: PSYC203	Course Title: Statistics II (Data Analysis)
	SPSS data analysis program will be introduced where students will create a data set, do data entry, clean up existing data sets, recode variables, conduct a simple and group frequency analysis, and conduct and interpret statistical tests such as chi-square, t-tests, One Way ANOVA, correlation, and simple regression.	
17.	Course Code: PSYC205	Course Title: Social Psychology I
	This course examines individuals in social contexts with their social roles, group process and intergroup relations. It also explores research methods, attitudes, social perception, conformity, leadership, group dynamics and the establishment of norms, emphasizing their effects on the individual.	
18.	Course Code: PSYC207	Course Title: Research Methods
	Research methods deals with the following areas: Selecting research subject, Traditional techniques based on secondary data, Determination of Data Sources, Survey technique, Data collection, tabulation, analysis and interpretation, Preparing a Research Report.	
19.	Course Code: PSYC209	Course Title: Psychology of Learning
	Learning theories, memory research, perception, information processing and problem solving are the key topics of this course.	
20.	Course Code: PSYC211	Course Title: Physiological Psychology
	An introduction to physiological psychology. During this course students will learn about the physiological mechanisms that underlie psychological processes of sensation, motivation, learning, memory, and emotion. Other topics include neurological disorders, schizophrenia, affective disorders, anxiety disorders, and psychopharmacology.	
21.	Course Code: PSYC202	Course Title: Clinical Psychology
	This course focuses on the contemporary practice of clinical psychology with emphasis on theories and techniques of behavioral assessment and the management of psychological disorders.	
22.	Course Code: PSYC204	Course Title: Experimental Psychology
	This is a course that will introduce students to the experimental aspects of psychology and philosophy of science and inquiry with an emphasis on experimental methodology, including how data is collected, organized, and interpreted in psychological research.	
23.	Course Code: PSYC206	Course Title: Developmental Psychology II
	This course, as a continuation of PSYC114, continues to introduce the main theories and concepts of developmental psychology. The course covers physical, cognitive, and social emotional development during adolescence and adulthood.	
24.	Course Code: PSYC208	Course Title: Social Psychology II
	Topics include self-concept, self-esteem, and gender identity and its elements such as conformity, compliance, and obedience, processes that influence social behavior, altruism, causes and control of aggression, and group performance, including group decision-making and leadership.	
25.	Course Code: PSYC301	Course Title: Cognitive Psychology
	The topics to be covered include perception, attention, memory, language and cognitive neuroscience.	
26.	Course Code: PSYC303	Course Title: Personality Theories I
	This course introduces personality theories and the important factors in the development of personality from birth to maturity.	

27.	Course Code: PSYC305	Course Title: Psychopathology I
	The definitions, classifications and causes of a variety of psychological disorders from a psychoanalytic perspective.	
28.	Course Code: PSYC302	Course Title: Industrial and Organizational Psychology
	This course covers the organizational topics about industrial psychology, studies the definitions such as leadership, job satisfaction, motivation theories, goal setting, organizational behavior, organizational development, and their effects on the functioning of institutions.	
29.	Course Code: PSYC304	Course Title: Personality Theories II
	Explores the major theories of personality as well as empirical studies on personality development, personality functioning, and psychopathology.	
30.	Course Code: PSYC306	Course Title: Psychopathology II
	The classifications and definitions of the psychological disorders according to APA standards.	
31.	Course Code: PSYC308	Course Title: Observation and Interviewing Techniques in Clinical Psychology
	Introduction to basis of psychotherapeutic interview methods, regulation of context, focus and duration of the therapy, determining the limits of therapy and intervention, and structuring the questions and content are included in this course.	
32.	Course Code: PSYC310	Course Title: Professional Ethics and Legal Issues
	This course is designed to provide an introduction to ethics in psychology, research, applications and training. Legal issues will also be emphasized throughout the course.	
33.	Course Code: PSYC401	Course Title: Psychological Testing
	This course includes basic concepts and principles of psychological testing, individual and group intelligence tests, achievement, ability and personality tests, interest inventories, their application and evaluations.	
34.	Course Code: PSYC403	Course Title: Theories of Psychotherapy
	This course will introduce students to the key philosophical and theoretical approaches such as Psychoanalytic and Psychodynamic Theory, Behaviour Therapy, Cognitive Behaviour Therapy, Rational Emotive Behaviour Therapy, Solution-Focused Brief Therapy etc.	
35.	Course Code: PSYC405	Course Title: Field Practice
	Students will be required to complete a summer internship/practicum at the end of their 3rd year. After they have completed their summer internship, they will be required to attend a practicum supervision that will professionally prepare them for the field and help develop their case presentation skills while learning to develop case formulations.	
36.	Course Code: PSYC407	Course Title: Traffic Psychology
	Basic concepts and theories in traffic psychology, research methods, driver behavior models, attitudes and individual driver behaviors; risk behaviors in traffic, psycho-technical evaluation; development of driver behavior and culture.	
37.	Course Code: PSYC402	Course Title: Health Psychology
	This course is designed to introduce the basic concepts of Health Psychology. Students will be introduced to different medical disorders and diseases and the implications for the psychological health and impact on psychological functioning of individuals with these disorders.

	Basic concepts about creativity and its place in the physiological and psychological human structure, basic information about the technical structure, management and development of creativity and the place of creativity in the human thought process.	
41.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Communication Psychology
	Basic communication concepts, skills and social and cultural factors affecting communication; factors that impede verbal and nonverbal communication communication.	
42.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Stress and Stress Management
	Concepts of stress in the physiological, psychological, cognitive and behavioral domains, similar and related concepts, stress theories, and the physical phases of stress response.	
43.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Memory in Cognitive Psychology
	Main topics, theories, controversies, research results and discussions of memory particularly from the perspective of cognitive psychology.	
44.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Advanced Learning Psychology
	Introduction to basic findings in the literature of learning psychology, and the contributions of these findings to the understanding of behaviors in daily life and the clinical environment; different learning environments and types, including behavioral influences and theories such as those found in the Pavlovian and operant conditioning literature; introduction to clinical applications related to learning psychology studies and current learning psychology articles.	
45.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Cultural and Cross-Cultural Psychology
	Introduction to the field of cultural and cross-cultural psychology, including ways of conducting real-life psychological studies and identifying culture-specific information through the use of qualitative research methods.

	The historical and philosophical history of psychology, opinions proposed regarding the human mind, some important historical and social events that shape this field, the process of psychology becoming a science; life stories of important psychologists contributing to the field.	
51.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Human Resources Management
	Consideration of human resources and the examination of the duties of human resources departments.	
52.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Environmental Psychology
	The importance of human interaction with the environment and culture; defining the field of environmental psychology, main concepts, theories and methods, developing environmental sensitivity, understanding human behavior within the social and physical environment, world, and universe.	
53.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Neuropsychology
	The definition and scope of neuropsychology; brain-behavior relationships, how the brain is cognitively responsible for language, memory, executive and spatial functions, developmental and neuropsychological disorders, clinical approaches to these disorders.

	Comprehension of the processes of theory-research-practice in the field of clinical, social, developmental and health psychology through a psychology project.

	Basic principles of clinical practice with children and adolescents; practical examination of psychoanalytic approaches with children and adolescents; principles of working with children and adolescents; methods of interviewing psychopathologic groups according to different disease groups; main topics to be observed in clinical treatment with children and adolescents; interview techniques with children and adolescents, the dynamics of adolescents and the family.

	Traumatic stress disorder in children, adolescents and adults; psychological support processes after trauma; expectations in events leading to, or occurring after trauma; common reactions to anxiety and traumatic experiences; trauma and loss sensation, reactions to death and loss concepts of children; therapeutic techniques, post-disaster school-based interventions, helping family members and friends; legal and ethical issues related to trauma.

59.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Forensic Psychology
	Forensic psychology and its relation with other disciplines, legal systems and related law concepts, crime and criminal issues, criminal, victim and process in trials and the psychological processes involved.	
60.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Sports Psychology
	An introduction the field of sport psychology and its research areas, the basic concepts in the field, the psychological factors affecting the performance, motivation, group and team relationships, sensation and perception, competition, feedback, and the factors affecting concentration.	
61.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Introduction to Human sexuality
	In this course, students will learn about how research in sexuality is done, by whom, and their findings along with pioneers in the field. Students will be taught sexual anatomy, the sexual response cycle, the physiology involved in the sexual response cycle (hormones, neurological basis) and the psychology associated with sexuality (relationships, emotions, past experiences, etc.) Also clinically diagnosed sexual disorders and dysfunctions will be examined with treatment modalities. In addition, contraception, pregnancies, sexually transmitted diseases and sexual orientation are among the topics that will be covered in class.	
62.	Course Code: PSYCXXX	Course Title: Data Analysis I
	This class is designed to teach students the basic foundation of SPSS and quantitative data analysis. Data entry, creating a data set, changing variables, and statistical tests will be taught.
