A Bit of Partnership Theory

- Partnership is an investment of time and resources from all sides. It should be entered into only after careful consideration and prayer.
- No one partners with everyone and this is actually good.
- Partnership should only be entered into when everyone is convinced that each party is truly needed and adds value to the specific, agreed-upon vision and goals.
- Experts say that it's important to grow into partnership as a gradual progression in order to gain momentum and to build relationship and trust.
- Trust and accountability in partnership are essential and are not opposites.
- Partnerships should be periodically evaluated, if possible with metrics, and this
 evaluation should be based upon the effectiveness of the partnership to advance
 the common vision/goals.



PARTNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

We will...

- · Pursue being disciples worth multiplying.
- Define success as "reaching this generation" and will pursue multiplication, rather than addition, acknowledging that this vision and some of the principles may feel counter-intuitive at times.
- Love and honor the existing church as it is while seeking to mobilize it for what
 it can be.
- Emphasize discipling groups and not only individuals.
- Serve under the **leadership** of the follow-up system in matters that relate to *this* partnership.
- Share successes and failures, communicating and implementing feedback from follow-up leadership and fellow practitioners.
- Provide consistent, thorough, and prompt reporting on all assigned contacts in order to enable partnership, assess progress, and plan strategically.
- Become familiar with online collaboration software (if/when this applies to specific partners).
- Commit to resolving all conflict as soon as possible, including accepting help from others.
- Seek to be culturally relevant while ultimately believing that the proclaimed Gospel is the power of God for salvation for all who believe, not "contextualized" strategies.
- Commit to ongoing training.
- Gain familiarity with DMM tools and concepts.
- Attend all M2DMM meetings (every 3-6 months).
- Pursue higher levels of language in order to meet with non-English speakers.

We will prioritize the following for first meetings with contacts:

- Get to know them. Ask good questions. Listen/Learn about their journey.
- Establish good DNA from the beginning—discovering, sharing, obeying.
- Cast vision for reaching their family, friends, community and the nations with God's truth.
- Do not answer all their questions directly, but teach them to find the answers in scripture where they can learn directly from God.
- Provide access to the Word (giving a book, helping download an app, teaching them how to read/study the Word).
- Reading the Word together.
- Introduce an informal **group study model** (ie: DBS) that includes obeying and sharing and encourage them to engage their social group(s).
- Pray with/for them.

We aim for churches that...

- Have Jesus as Lord, love God, love others, make more disciples and multiply churches
- 3+ people (perhaps a family)
- Meet 3+ times/month
- Engage in studying God's Word together
- Use a meeting model that includes **accountability** (sharing and obeying)
- Do not have a foreigner "coach" present
- Receive **coaching**/accountability from one of our partners 2+ times/month (likely through the church group's primary facilitator/leader)
- Are not dependent upon outside resources (money, transportation, location, etc.)

OUR BELIEF

The Scripture is God's Word, inspired by God, written by men; it is authoritative, active, eternal, inerrant and trustworthy. It provides knowledge for salvation through faith and repentance and instruction for godly living for all people at all times. It is the supreme authority for the life and practice of individual believers and Christ's Church. There is only one true living God who eternally exists in three persons. These are God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

God the Father is creator, sustainer, holy, provider, and ruler He is all powerful, all knowing and sovereign over all things. He is life and gives life. We are created by Him and saved by Him. He is revealed in creation and he is Father in truth to all those who gain access to Him through belief in the Son. Jesus Christ is the Son of God, conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of a virgin, he is 100% God and 100% man. Jesus is eternal, all powerful, the image of God. He is the ultimate prophet, priest and king. All things were created by him and through him. All things are subject to him and held together through him. He came to earth in the flesh, was tempted but remained sinless. Through his life, death and resurrection he reconciles to the Father all who believe in him. He is the one and only mediator between God and man. He will return one day in power and glory to judge the world and save all who believe in him. The Holy Spirit is powerful, and responsible for great and mighty works. He bears witness about Christ and is the fulfillment of the promise of Christ. He is the guarantee of salvation for all of those who are in Christ and now dwells in them and intercedes for them. The Spirit draws people to the Son and convicts people of their sins. He teaches, guides, and helps believers. A New Testament church is a local congregation of baptized believers, linked by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the two ordinances of Christ, Baptism and the Lord Supper, governed by His laws, exercising the gifts, endowed in them by His Word, and seeking to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth. Each Church operates under the Lordship of Christ. In such a congregation each member is responsible and accountable to Christ as Lord. (Matthew 16:15-19; 18:15-20; Acts 2:41-42,47; 5:11-14; 6:3-6; 13:1-3; 14:23,27; 15:1-30; 16:5; 20:28; Romans 1:7; 1 Corinthians 1:2; 3:16; 5:4-5; 7:17; 9:13-14; 12; Ephesians 1:22-23;2:19-22; 3:8-11,21; 5:22-32; Philippians 1:1; Colossians 1:18; 1 Timothy 2:9-14; 3:1-15; 4:14; Hebrews 11:39-40; 1 Peter 5:1-4; Revelation 2-3; 21:2-3.)

Believer Baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Savior, the believer's death to sin, the burial of the old life, and the resurrection to walk in newness of life in Christ Jesus.

The Lord's Supper is a symbolic act of obedience for Believers, through partaking of the bread and the fruit of the vine, memorialize the death of the Redeemer and anticipate His second coming. (Matthew 3:13-17; 26:26-30; 28:19-20; Mark 1:9-11; 14:22-26; Luke 3:21-22; 22:19-20; John 3:23; Acts 2:41-42; 8:35-39; 16:30-33; 20:7; Romans 6:3-5; 1 Corinthians 10:16,21;11:23-29; Colossians 2:12.)
