

The Parish Council continues to meet "virtually" via Zoom on the usual third Monday at 7.30 p.m. The meetings are public and any resident can attend. Joining details for Zoom are published with the agenda on the website www.stfaithspc.norfolkparishes.gov.uk or can be obtained from the Clerk 898621 stfaithpc@gmail.com

The conversion of all the Parish Council footway lighting to the latest LED lanterns has been completed. This will have a long term benefit of reduced energy and maintenance costs. This project has been funded entirely from Community Infrastructure Levy paid to the Council in respect of the Lovell development off Manor Road and has not been taken from the annual Council Tax which the Parish Council decided to leave unchanged for the 2021/22 financial year.

The problems with the surface of the cemetery drive are ongoing and samples of the materials used have been sent for independent analysis and an engineering consultant will be asked to provide the Council with a report.

The Council undertook clearance of ivy from the rear of the Churchyard wall and will keep this under review.

The latest draft of the Greater Norwich Local Plan under consideration shows an area of land off West Lane designated for up to 50 dwellings which is an increase from that previously put forward. The Council has objected to this increase.

The Council has received reports of large quantities of suspicious compost being dumped on the verges of Hog Bog Lane. The authorities have been alerted as this could be drug related.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be on April 19th. at 7.30 p.m. via Zoom



What is the history of the hot cross bun?

Some believe the hot cross bun originates from St Albans, where Brother Thomas Rocliffe, a 14th Century monk at St Albans Abbey, developed a similar recipe called an 'Alban Bun' and distributed the bun to the local poor on Good Friday, starting in 1361.

In 1592, during the reign of Elizabeth I, it was forbidden to sell hot cross buns and other spiced breads, except at burials, on Good Friday, or at Christmas.

If you broke the decree then you had to give all of your buns to the poor. As a result, hot cross buns were primarily made in home kitchens. Further attempts to suppress the sale of these items took place during the reign of James I of England/James VI of Scotland (1603-1625).

The first definite record of hot cross buns comes from a London street cry: "Good Friday comes this month, the old woman runs. With one or two a penny hot cross buns", which appeared in Poor Robin's Almanack for 1733.

What are the traditions around hot cross buns?

English folklore includes many superstitions surrounding hot cross buns.

One of them says that buns baked and served on Good Friday will not spoil or grow mouldy during the subsequent year. If hung in the kitchen, they are said to protect against fires and ensure that all breads turn out perfectly. The hanging bun is replaced each year.

Another tradition encourages keeping a bun for medicinal purposes. A piece of it given to someone who is ill is said to help them recover. If taken on a sea voyage, hot cross buns are said to protect against shipwreck.



A hot cross bun is a spiced sweet bun made with currants or raisins, marked with a cross on the top, and traditionally eaten on Good Friday. The eating of hot cross buns marks the end of Lent because they are made with dairy products which are forbidden during this period. Plain buns are traditionally eaten hot or toasted during Lent, beginning on Shrove Tuesday and through to Good Friday.

Different parts of the hot cross bun have a certain meaning. The cross represents the crucifixion of Jesus, and the spices inside signify the spices used to embalm him at his burial.

How are hot cross buns made?

The standard hot cross bun recipe consists of strong bread flour, full fat milk, butter and yeast. Sultanas or raisins are then added to the mixture with eggs, cinnamon and even orange zest.

Crosses are traditionally cut into the surface of the bun, however a simple way to make them is to use a paste of water and flour. The buns are then baked in a hot oven for 20 minutes till golden brown and then brushed with a coat of glaze.

They can then be served hot or cold, buttered or dry on Good Friday and throughout Easter.

HOT CROSS BUNS RECIPE

2 sachets dried yeast 1 oz caster sugar 0.5 pts handhot water 2 oz lard 1.5 lb plain flour 3 oz currents 2 level teasps mixed spice 1 oz chopped peel 0.5 level teasp cinnamon 0.25 warm milk 0.5 level teasp nutmeg 3 oz shortcrust pastry 1 level teasp salt Beaten egg or milk

GLAZE: 6 level tablesps granulated sugar 8 tablesps water

Sifi flour, spices and salt together and then add sugar. Rub in lard.

Stir in fruit and peel.

Add dried yeast with water and milk and mix well.

Knead for 10 minutes.

Leave to rise for 45 minutes in a warm place.

Knead for a further 2 or 3 minutes.

Divide into 18 (3 oz each) and shape into buns.

Leave for a further 20 -30 minutes to rise in a warm place.

Meanwhile make pastry crosses to place on buns.

Brush with beaten egg or milk.

Bake on Gas Mark 7 for 10 - 12 minutes.

For Glaze:

Put sugar and water into a saucepan and stir over a low heat until sugar has dissolved then boil for 2 minutes.

When buns are cool, brush with glaze.

'Miles for Momo' Mandy's New Year of Fundraising for the Sheep.

Hello everyone, I have started a whole new year of fundraising to help the wonderful small animal sanctuary "The Mirkwood Rest Home for Retired Sheep".

The last 12 months have been extremely tough for the whole world (I lost both my parents during this time). It has also been incredibly hard for small, good causes who do not have big fundraising sets ups or people employed to help them. I have always chosen to support these smaller places where the money goes directly to the animals and I am extremely proud to be dedicating another year of fundraising to help this fantastic place.

During January I completed a virtual running event called 'The Frozen Accumulator'. This involved running the same number of miles for the date of the month from home. So, on 1st January I ran one mile, on 2nd I ran two miles, 3rd three miles, 4th four miles and so on right up to the 31st January. It got harder as the month went on, but I completed it all and managed to run it all too, no walking. In total my January running mileage was 507 miles, I was a bit tired afterwards! That was the first event in my fundraising year, although I could not publicise it via this Journal due to lockdown.

All my Spring Races have been cancelled, and my big target race The Tunnel Ultra has been postponed until September. The Tunnel Ultra involves running 200 miles in darkness through the Coomb cycle tunnel in Somerset. It is a mile long tunnel, so we run up & down 200 times! To date only 10 people have ever finished the event and no women. It has an extremely tough time limit of only 55 hours which will allow no time for sleeping or even a short nap. I am going to give it my absolute best shot and any other events I do in the late spring or early summer will all be part of my training plan.

Momo was a lovely gentle sheep who passed away last December at the sheep sanctuary. I witnessed the last 4 months of her life and the incredibly kind care she received via a daily video. It is for Momo and other sheep like her that I am inspired to raise funds for the Mirkwood sanctuary.


The gentleman who runs it, Andy Bailey, does everything voluntarily so every penny raised will go directly towards paying for feed and essential veterinary care for the sheep.

Please be Careful and Courteous on your Bike

During these difficult weeks of lockdown, we can at least get some exercise outdoors in the form of walking, jogging or cycling near to home around St. Faiths, where we are privileged to have many country lanes and cycle tracks.

My wife and I are members of the Ramblers Association, so we take regular short walks on most days and we are very familiar with the most popular routes, including for example, Bullock Hill and Quaker Lane.

These lanes are only about the width of a car, so when family groups of two or three are walking together, I'm happy to say that social distancing is always in evidence; the vast majority of people walk or jog in single file when passing others going in the opposite direction.

So what about our friends on bikes? Sorry to say, it is only the minority of cyclists who think to give walkers any warning that they will be overtaken from behind. To be fair, most will slow down, but there are some cyclists on racing bikes who overtake the pedestrians at high speed with no warning. This is totally irresponsible and unnecessary. We've witnessed several "near misses" so far and I feel it is only a matter of time before an avoidable accident takes place.

This appeal to cyclists is clear: Please slow down when pedestrians are ahead; remember they can neither see you nor hear you if they are walking ahead in the same direction. Always ring your bell if you have one and if you don't have a bell, then why not (in good time) sound a friendly "Hi, coming through on your left (or right)" and take special care when small chidren or dogs are part of any walk group. Nobody wants an accident, and just a little courtesy costs nothing.
