The point of this scheme, which has been running elsewhere for several years now, is that YOU have control: you can reduce, increase, pause or even cancel your donation if your circumstances change. Any amount you are able to give would be very welcome and would enable us to plan our maintenance and the upkeep of the church more efficiently. Thank you to those of you who have already joined the scheme, we really do appreciate it.

As we continue to journey through this Eastertide, we give thanks for all that we have been given by the God who loves us and who was willing to give his Son for us so that we might have eternal life through him. We rejoice in the Risen Christ who lives in our hearts and who knows us and loves us just as we are.

Since the last edition of the Journal, the Parish Council has co-opted two new councillors – Michael O'Connor and Christien Quinton bringing the total number to nine which still leaves two vacancies.

The Council has been in discussion with the St.Faiths Centre who had suggested a Community Access Defibrillator at that end of the village. It has been agreed that the Council will purchase one which will be installed on the front wall of the Centre and the Centre has generously offered to pay 50% of the purchase price. The defibrillator will, like all public access ones, be accessed following a 999 call if deemed appropriate.

Following discussions with Broadland DC, agreement has been reached to access the s.106 funds held by BDC following the development at Manor Road to fund additional play equipment at Horsham Park which will cost in the region of £125k.

All allotments are currently let with a short waiting list. Tenants have been advised that, after no change for a decade, rent for a basic plot will increase by £3/year from January 2025

The bus shelter on Manor Road at the Newton Street junction which has been redundant since the construction of the A140 bypass has been effectively reversed to provide a shelter for those using Newton Park.

Urban verge cutting which is carried out through the central part of the village will be carried out "in house" with a contribution from Norfolk County Council who had previously done the work. The Council have decided on this to have more local control over the work carried out.



# Simnel Cake (Traditional Easter Cake)

Preparation time less than 30 mins Cooking time 1 to 2 hours Serves 10-12

#### Ingredients for the almond paste

250g/9oz caster sugar 250g/9oz ground almonds 2 free-range eggs beaten 1 tsp almond essence

#### For the cake

175g/6oz butter or margarine, plus extra for greasing
175g/6oz soft brown sugar
3 free-range eggs, beaten
175g/6oz plain flour
pinch salt
½ tsp ground mixed spice (optional)
350g/12oz mixed raisins, currants and sultanas
55g/2oz chopped mixed peel
½ lemon, grated zest only
1–2 tbsp apricot jam
1 free-range egg, beaten for glazing

#### Method

1. For the almond paste, place the sugar and ground almonds in a bowl. Add enough beaten egg and mix to a fairly soft consistency. Add the almond essence and knead for 1 minute until the paste is smooth and pliable. Roll out a third of the almond paste to make a circle 18cm/7in in diameter and reserve the remainder for the cake topping.

2. Preheat oven to 140C/120C Fan/Gas 1. Grease and line a 18 cm/7in cake tin.

3. For the cake, cream the butter and sugar together until pale and fluffy. Gradually beat in the eggs until well incorporated and then sift in the flour, salt and mixed spice (if using) a little at a time. Finally, add the mixed dried fruit, peel and grated lemon zest and stir into the mixture.

4. Put half the mixture into the cake tin. Smooth the top and cover with the circle of almond paste. Add the rest of the cake mixture and smooth the top leaving a slight dip in the centre to allow for the cake to rise. Bake in the preheated oven for  $1\frac{3}{4}$  hours. Test by inserting a skewer in the middle – if it comes out clean, it is ready. Once baked, remove from the oven and set aside to cool on a wire rack.

5. Brush the top of the cooled cake with the apricot jam. Divide the remainder of the almond paste in half. Roll out a circle to cover the top of the cake with one half and form 11 small balls with the other half. Place the circle of paste on the jam glaze and set the balls round the edge. Brush the cake topping with a little beaten egg.

6. Preheat the grill to high. Place the cake onto a baking tray and grill for 1-2 minutes, or until the top of the marzipan begins to brown. Alternatively, lightly heat the cake topping using a cook's blowtorch, until the marzipan is golden brown.

Simnal cakes have been known since at least medieval times,

Simnal means a rich fruitcake coated with almond paste which it is claimed was invented by Lambert Simnal who also claimed to be the Earl of Warwick and who made a bid for the English throne in the late 15th Century.

The cake was traditionally associated with Mothering Sunday the day that occurs on the fourth Sunday of Lent - do not confuse Mothering Sunday with Mother's Day, the two are entirely different. Mothering Sunday was a special day in the Christian calendar when people visited their mother church or cathedral.

Conventionally 11 marzipan balls are used to decorate the cake symbolising the 12 apostles minus Judas Iscariot.


