# MCCOY'S GLASS OPENING 20 APRIL 2020 – AS A SUPPLIER TO ESSENTIAL SERVICES

Some good news. Yesterday the government announced some changes to the rules for the next phase of South Africa's COVID -19 Lockdown.

Glaziers have specifically been included in the list of artisans, allowed to do EMERGENCY repair work on residences only.

In addition to this the supply of glass to companies providing essential services is also permitted, eg Glass required by hospitals

This means that glazing and the supply of glass for emergencies and where needed by companies deemed essential like hospitals is now allowed. As a leading glass company we have a responsibility to support this, and to support our customers.

In a nutshell this means that from Monday 20 April 2020 McCoy's Glass will be able to supply customers who require glass for Home emergencies or for supply to Essential services.

In line with Lockdown rules we will not be operating at full capacity and will only supply glass to customers who have obtained their CIPC certificates (click here to apply) and the necessary authority to operate. Customers on placement of any orders will also be required to send us their CIPC certificate together with written confirmation of where the glass will be used. Basically, McCoy's will be operating within the laws of the SA government, strictly complying with the Lockdown regulations.

Please note that we will not be open for collections and we will be applying strict internal safety procedures to combat the spread of COVID-19. Please allow drivers to wash hands when doing deliveries and no sharing of pens. Drivers and crew have strict instructions re: social distancing. – Please support us in these endeavors – STRONGER TOGETHER!

It is our privilege and honour to now step up as a materials provider to Essential Services. McCoy's Glass is humbled by the opportunity to serve our customers and our country. To all our customers please be assured that we will work hard over this challenging period to support you.
