East Coast Tasmania

Day 1. Wed 2 February: Home - Launceston

Good morning and welcome aboard as we **pick you up from home** and make our way towards Tullamarine and our **flight to Launceston**. On arrival we collect our luggage and board the bus. First stop is **Yarns Artwork in Silk**, a large-scale textile project of four quilted, soft sculpture silk panels, one for each season, drawing you into the landscapes, culture & heritage of the Meander Valley People. Crafted by more than 300 local artists, it took 10,000 hours and 200 metres of hand-dyed silk to complete. Next, we make our way to the **stunning Tamar Valley** with stops along the way to take in the incredible views. Please do settle into the resort and freshen up before dinner. We will enjoy the facilities here for the next 2 nights.

Day 2. Thu 3 February: Beauty Point

After a lovely, cooked breakfast we have a little time to explore the amazing **Tamar Valley resort** we are staying at. Set on over 150 magnificent acres amid numerous spectacular lakes with breathtaking views and a gymnasium, tennis courts, heated indoor pool, sauna, heated spa, golf course, canoeing, paddle boats, games arcade and Swiss shopping village. So much to see in one place – do try some of the delicacies from the **Swiss Bakery** – YUM! This afternoon we head Northwest towards **Beauty Point**, a small riverside town. Seahorses are a star attraction in Beauty Point with the world's first seahorse aquarium, **Seahorse World**, dedicated to breeding and protecting these fascinating creatures. **Lunch today is at the Seahorse World Café**. Enjoy the gorgeous water views. We'll then head next door to **Platypus House**. Here we have the opportunity to view live platypus and echidnas. Be amazed by these unique animals in daylight conditions and in an indoor setting. You are guaranteed to see both these spectacular egg-laying mammals actively feeding and playing during the **guided tour**. Learn and be amazed about the biology of both mammals and how they live. At the conclusion of this full day we arrive back to our resort with time to freshen up and enjoy dinner.

Day 3. Fri 4 February: North East Coast

After a lovely, cooked breakfast we say farewell to our hosts and make our way North across Batman Bridge towards **Bridestowe Lavendar Farm**. The largest privately owned Lavendar farm in the World!! Whilst here we enjoy a guided tour and a lovely **Devonshire morning tea** (did someone say lavender scones!) Leaving the farm we make our way to **St Helens** - St Helens is the largest town on the north-east coast of Tasmania, on Georges Bay. It is known as the game fishing capital of Tasmania and is also renowned for its oysters. Lunch at the local Bayside Hotel with views of the water aplenty. After lunch we travel down the coast through Scamander on to **Bicheno**. Arriving late afternoon with plenty of time to freshen up for a lovely 2 course dinner.

Day 4. Sat 5 February Bicheno & Port Arthur

After a hearty cooked breakfast, we'll head out on the water for a tour in **Bicheno's Glass Bottom Boat**, an ecotourism experience providing us the opportunity to participate in marine sightseeing, including a running commentary on marine wildlife and general characteristics & history of the local area. Departing Bicheno, we enjoy a lovely **scenic drive down the East Coast** stopping for lunch along the way. Late afternoon we arrive in **Port Arthur**. The Fox and Hound Inn is home for tonight. This quaint **Olde English Tudor style hotel** is situated only 2km from Port Arthur. We'll enjoy dinner in at the Inn and after dinner, those who are feeling adventurous are welcome to join us on an optional **Port Arthur Ghost Tour**. This is a guided walking tour by lamplight around the ruins of the 19th century penal colony. We'll follow our expert guide through some of Port Arthur's more infamous buildings and ruins and hear vivid stories of unexplained events that have baffled and alarmed convicts, free settlers, soldiers, and visitors. Certainly, an evening full of mystery & intrigue. (Optional extra \$35pp – please advise us if you wish to join this tour when making your booking)

Day 5. Sun 6 February: Port Arthur

After our leisurely breakfast and we are off to **Port Arthur Historic Site** for the day. A special place of vivid history, cultural heritage, and stories so compelling, you'll want to hear them again and again. It's a place of global significance – one of the 11 places that make up the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Australian Convict Sites. And it's one of Australia's favourite tourist destinations. Discover the real people and living history of Port Arthur Historic Site. Please dress comfortably with layered clothing and wear comfortable shoes, suitable for walking. Make sure you have sunscreen and a hat. We will spend a few hours at the site. There is a café and coffee shop where you can purchase morning tea, lunch and snacks. Between 10:30am and 3:30pm daily, courtesy buggies provide a regular drop-off and pick-up service around the site for visitors with limited mobility. After a very interesting time at Port Arthur, we make our way to Hobart arriving early evening with time to settle in and refresh before dinner



Day 6. Mon 7 February: Richmond & MONA

Another enjoyable breakfast and we are off to **MONA (Museum of Old & New Art)**. Located on the banks of the Derwent, Mona is Australia's largest private museum with three levels of underground galleries, which visitors explore with custom-built, handheld technology, called the O, that tells them about the artworks on display. The artwork inside is described as unusual: an evolving collection. After an interesting morning we make our way to **Richmond**. We'll stop at the village where you are welcome to purchase yourself some lunch (we hear the bakery is exceptional!) Next, we are off to **Old Hobart Town model village**. Here we can walk through a miniature replica of Hobart as it was in the 1820s. As we stroll the streets of old Hobart, the informative signage tells a story of how and why Hobart was so important to the Australian colonies. Following our time at the model village we'll head into Richmond to enjoy a stroll around the full-size village and a visit to **Richmond Bridge**. The Bridge can lay claim to being the oldest existing stone arch bridge in Australia, erected in 1820. On our way back to Hobart we'll make a small detour to **Puddleduck Vineyard** to enjoy a tasting of the lovely wines created here along with some cheese platters. A great way to finish our day. We'll make our way back to our motel to relax a little before another lovely dinner

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Day 7. Tues 8 February: Bruny Island

With an early start this morning we make our way to the magnificent **Bruny Island**. Bruny Island sits off the Southeast coast of Tasmania. The local Bruny Islanders are producing some of the finest gourmet food products in Tasmania, making this one of the **best foodie tours** in Tasmania. Following a short 30 min drive to Kettering, we board the **ferry** departs for its 15-minute crossing. The coastlines are dominated by towering sea cliffs, mountains, seabirds, penguin colonies, seals, whales, shipwrecks and sweeping white sandy beaches. Our Hosts - **Bruny Island Safaris** provide us with a spectacular day tour with nature, wilderness, coast and heritage on Bruny Island and Kettering. We will be guided through the **Mount Mangana rainforests** in search of **White Wallaby** in the wild, cross the narrow sandy isthmus known as **The Neck** and onwards to the **Cape Bruny Lighthouse Station** and join **Australia's southern most lighthouse tour**. Along the way we stop at many of the **Bruny Island food producers**, lookouts, and beaches with ample time for short walks or a paddle in the cool ocean waters of the **Tasman Sea**. We will experience some of the **Bruny Island short walks, Bruny Island sights, history, culture, wildlife, and Bruny Island food**.

Day 8. Sat 9 Feb: Hobart to Home


