Portland on the southwest coast was the site of Victoria's first permanent European settlement in 1834, with the town quickly prospering due to fishing, pastoral and agricultural industries. This much-overlooked coastal town is full of history and rugged beauty. With streets dotted with heritage buildings and an industrial port that mingles effortlessly in with the abundance of wildlife that saturates the area this region has something to offer everyone.

South of Portland is Cape Nelson which includes a 210-hectare state park bordering rugged cliffs with the Cape Nelson Lighthouse located on the coast's southern tip.

West of Portland is the small community of Cape Bridgewater. From here, the Discovery Bay Coastal Park stretches 50 kilometres north-west along the coast to the small town of Nelson, close to the state border with South Australia. Cape Bridgewater has several lookouts perched above the beaches which overlook Bridgewater Bay. Fur seals can be sighted in the area during their breeding season.

Port Fairy - Uncover history in every corner of this charming fishing village at the end of the Great Ocean Road. The last destination on Victoria's famed Shipwreck Coast, Port Fairy boasts wide streets lined with nineteenth century cottages, great Norfolk pines and old stone churches. With many fine examples of 1800s architecture and more than 50 buildings classified by the National Trust, Port Fairy is the perfect holiday spot for history buffs. Peruse the diverse array of boutiques, antique stores, and art and craft shops scattered throughout the town.

Day 1: HOME TO PORTLAND

(L/D)

Welcome on board our 5-day tour to **Portland and Victoria's Far South West Coast**. This morning we make our way to the Far South West of the State, stopping for **morning tea** along the way. We head to the **Narrapumelap Homestead** in the little village of Wickliffe. We'll enjoy a tour of the French Gothic Mansion here and a light lunch before our afternoon's journey past Hamilton and down to our destination of Portland. We arrive with time to unpack and relax before dining in the motel restaurant

Day 2: PORTLAND (B/L/D)

After our lovely breakfast we spend the day discovering the beautiful coastal town of Portland via the Portland Cable Tram which takes one of the most scenic tram tracks routes in Australia. The track runs along Henty Beach, giving a close-up view of a working, natural deep-water harbour, before climbing to the cliff top giving panoramic views of the harbour and Portland Bay. It then passes alongside the historically significant 'ploughed field' on the way to the World War II Memorial Lookout Tower. The tram will transport us to a number of lovely destinations around the town. We'll spend some time at the **Power House Museum**, with a unique collection of veteran, vintage and classic cars motor bikes, stationary motors, tractors, fully restored Melbourne Cable Tram and memorabilia. Next stop is the Portland Botanic Gardens, a hidden tranguil beauty, established in the 1850s by William Allitt. The second oldest garden in Australia with croquet lawns and native & exotic plants. We'll enjoy a lovely lunch in the garden before again boarding the tram to head to the Maritime Discovery Centre & Museum. The museum includes displays documenting the region's rich maritime history including whaling, ship wrecks, rescue, navigation and the local fishing industry. Centrepiece of the museum is the 1858 Portland lifeboat, famous for its role in the 'Admella' rescue of 1859. The lifeboat is one of the oldest remaining unrestored intact vessels in Australia, possibly the world. After a busy day exploring we return to our motel with a little time to relax before another lovely 2 course dinner **Overnight – Comfort Inn Richmond Henty** (4 nights)

Day 3: CAPE BRIDGEWATER & NELSON (B/L/D)

This morning after another lovely breakfast we head out on a tour of the town. Our host will provide some informative commentary on all things Portland on our **Town Tour**. After our tour we travel to Cape Bridgewater to the Blowholes. Formed mainly of basalt (black) and Scoria Purple) rock, these blowholes create spectacular spouts of sea spray during high seas. Whilst here we'll also visit the **Petrified Forest**. Some say it was formed when a forest of moonah trees was smothered by a large sand dune. Water seeped down through the sand to form a crust of sandstone on the outside of the trunks, decaying the organic matter, leaving behind "petrified" trunks. Others believe it was formed through the natural erosion of stone in the ground, with the remains looking coincidentally like fossilized tree trunks. What do you think? Time for some lunch which today is at the lovely **Bridgewater Bay Café**. Enjoy the lovely views over **Shelly Beach** with your lunch. This afternoon we make our way to Nelson, a small fishing town on the lands of the Gunditimara people. Nelson is located at the mouth of the Glenelg River and Discovery Bay, a few kilometres from the South Australian border. Whilst here we will enjoy a cruise on the Glenelg River, set in the majestic Lower Glenelg National Park. Afternoon tea will be provided whilst on board. Following our cruise, we'll return to our motel in Portland for another great dinner together

Day 4: PORT FAIRY (B/D)

After another fabulous breakfast we head to **Narrawong** and the **Bay of Whales Gallery**. The Gallery proudly presents some of the very best realistic animal and bird paintings in Australia by Brett Jarrett. The Gallery showcases sophisticated, world class paintings presented in a custom built professional gallery. Next, we move on to **Port Fairy**- voted Victorias number 1 Top Tourism Town. Noted for its quaint old time feel, Port Fairy is a credit to its locals who keep the village in wonderful order. ALL ABOARD... as we join Captain Jane, & Miley the dog aboard the Mulloka for a fun and informative scenic cruise around the Port Fairy Bay. Cruises will be conducted in groups of 12 allowing some of the group time to explore the wharf area and grab a coffee. After our time on the Wharf we head off to discover more about this quaint little town with our local guide including the bluestone cottages, fine antique shops and original Victorian buildings. With our newfound knowledge we head into the town with plenty of time to explore it for ourselves and grab some lunch. Later in the afternoon we make our way back to Portland with a stop at **Portland Strawberries**, a local farm gate who only sell strawberries they have grown on their property. Our shout for a **lovely homemade ice cream! Yum!** Tonight we enjoy another lovely 2 course dinner. Rest up as we head home tomorrow.

Day 5: PORTLAND to HOME

This morning after another hearty breakfast we bid farewell to Portland as we begin our journey home. We head towards **Colac** where we enjoy a comfort stop and morning tea. A little further towards home and we'll stop at the beautiful **Oakdene Winery**, a family-owned vineyard situated in the heart of the Bellarine Peninsula on stunning coastal farmland. Nestled amongst a mass of birch trees we'll enjoy **lunch at Mr Grubb @ Oakdene**. A fabulous way to finish off a lovely week together. Avoiding Melbourne's busy traffic, we board the **Ferry at Queenscliff** for a **relaxing sail across the bay**. Arriving in Sorrento with **transfers back home**, having enjoyed another lovely holiday with **Daytripper Tours**
