What is Architectural Control?

One of the main functions of the HOA is to monitor and review proposed building and exterior renovation projects. This not only includes the construction of new homes, but also construction of fences, home additions and even landscaping projects. Changes in siding color, color of shingles and garage door colors are also included along with driveways, swimming pools, solar panels and satellite dishes.

Per the *Covenants*:

"It is the responsibility of the homeowner to submit plans and specifications to the Architectural Committee for review and approval prior to any proposed construction of any new structure and/or any proposed significant changes to existing structures, including but not limited to, dwelling additions, fences, trees, solar panels, roofing, exterior paint colors, or other significant elements, but excluding routine upkeep and maintenance."

What is included under landscaping?

"... no plantings or landscaping exceeding the height of four (4) feet at maturity shall be permitted in the rear yard setback area for all lots that adjoin either the golf course or any lake. It is the intention that golf views and lake views of adjoining properties shall not be blocked or screened by plantings or landscaping and it is not intended to prohibit planting, but merely to control the nature and extent of same and to protect any open space character of the property."
