1.2 Postponement of AGM (to 4 August 2021)

This morning the Executive of Souths met to discuss the Annual General Meeting scheduled for tomorrow night.

The Executive discussed the current COVID restrictions (face masks and social distancing requirements) and the lack of a final audit opinion from our Auditor on the 2020/21 financial report.

As per the constitution, the club cannot hold an AGM without Audited Financial Statements from the previous year. It is critical this is complied with to provide members with a complete set of accounts with third party verification. I believe that the right course of action is to postpone the meeting until this is fully complied with. I see this as a critical item in maintaining the integrity of the committee process (which you have entrusted to us).

For full disclosure (financially), the club remains in a healthy financial position:

- Cash at Bank as at year end (31 May) was \$77K
- The financial result is expected to be break even for the financial year (up from last years deficit of \$42k)
- This includes expenditure of over \$85k on cricket infrastructure last year
- Draft accounts have been submitted to the auditor Once the executive has the final audit report, it
 will be distributed to all members prior to the meeting.

Also, based upon the current COVID requirements, the club would need to limit the number of people attending the AGM to 40 plus require face masks to be worn at all times. The club is proud of our COVID compliance record and we felt this added to the decision above to postpone - to ensure the maximum number of people are able to attend the meeting.

Given this decision, all current applications for committee roles will be held as is and the absentee voting period will be extended. I encourage all members to attend that AGM in person or electronically and to vote (either in person or Absentee vote).

I sincerely apologise for this decision, but I believe this is in the best interests of the club and our members, to ensure compliance with the constitution and provide members with better access due to COVID restrictions.

7 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is a great privilege to present this report as President of this great club with nearly 125 years of history. We are a proud club. A club that has earned respect. The club of Chappell, Trimble, Redgrave, Archer, Cutting and Stanlake.

We are also the club in many respects, of modern day cricketers with fight.

This is what I saw during the 2020/21 season.

A season of ups and downs - but one that sets us up for the future.

The club experienced a number of highs and lows during the season. The highlights of the season came in many forms – not the least:

- 6th Grade one day premiership the first premiership in six years in any competition (first final in five years)
- Lord Taverners minor premiership and semi-final lead the South zone points during the regular season and first Tavs semi final in nearly a decade
- Women's semi-final The Jodie Fields Shield side made the semi-finals for the second year running.
 Unluckily short of a final by 15 runs after a tense game again eventual premiers University.
- 4th Grade semi-final determined effort by the 4th grade side lead by Corey Taylor to make the semi-finals in a grade that has been very challenging for Souths for a number of years

As President of the club however, my overall highlight was that all grades (from Mens 1st Grade to 6th Grade, Womens, Taverners, Under 19s, Warehouse and sub districts) were all in the finals race until late January. The club has not gone so deep in all grades for a very long time. This showed the underlying effort that was put in by all players and how we played a lot better than the 8th in the club championship would show.

1st Grade as our flagship showed real determination scoring regularly over 300 runs each innings. After 8 rounds of the season we had one victory and seven draws (technically undefeated). While we struggled to bowl sides out, our determined batting kept us in all games – a true testament to the players lead by Lucky Peterson and coached by Kepler Wessels.

Special congratulations to Aryan Jain (most runs in first grade - 2 day cricket) and Corey Taylor (most runs in 4th Grade) for the special seasons they had.

Constitutional Reform

The club made strong advancements in its internal governance processes. At the 2020 Annual General Meeting, the club committed to reviewing the Constitution and to make a number of amendments to renew the Constitutions currency, review membership classes and provide further direction to the club moving forward.

On 31 May 2021 the club held an Extraordinary General Meeting to determine the proposed amendments. The changes, amongst other things, included:

- adopting new colours (green and maroon);
- new membership processes and expectations, including removal and appeal;
- new voting structure;
- removal of proxy voting and adoption of absentee voting;
- · new end of financial year for the club; and
- AGM to be held in July in the future.

It was terrific that all members present adopted the 275 amendments with an unanimous vote. These amendments will put the club in good stead into the future.

Looking forward

The committee has worked hard over the off season in 2021. The committee is determined to set up the club for success in the future. While a lot of these changes are painful, they have been made with a lens of "what is best for the club long term". As President, I am determined to return the club to its rightful place – the strongest Premier Grade Cricket Club in Queensland. This will not be easy, but we are aiming to be the best.

We are also determined to see the club's cricket infrastructure improve. The committee has an ambitious program to upgrade all cricketing infrastructure at Fehlberg Park – to turn the facility into a first class arena. This must include a material upgrade to cricket and change facilities to cater for the growth of womens cricket in the South Brisbane region. The club is 100% committed to the growth of womens cricket – and we will make announcements in the near future on this growth.

The next two season will see a dramatic improvement in the overall results of the club (which I am confident of). I implore all past members to get involved again – we are on the move!!

Finally, as President, all I do is claim credit on behalf of the tireless workers our club has. Without our volunteers, coaches and workers, cricket would not be possible.

- All players and members for their support over the past season. Thank you for allowing me to lead you.

8 TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to report that SBDCC has had a positive financial result for the 2020-21 period. With a bank balance of \$77K, we also recorded an operating surplus of \$28K in comparison to the loss of \$42K during the prior period. Although there was a spike in expenses by 39%, we also managed to have an increase in our income by 87%. To achieve this result even with the impact of COVID-19, has been a monumental effort by all those involved.

Summary of Significant events impacting on Finances

There were a few times that we had to close or have restrictions around the club during the season due to COVID-19 government restrictions that limited our club routines of generating income mainly through canteen sales.

The canteen operations were outsourced, thus reducing the purchases component in the canteen for the club. This has played a major role in eliminating the operating deficit we were in the prior period.

Capital purchases such as the Picket Fence on Norman Gray and Jack Cooke, walking sprinkler, boundary rope and mobile net have been some of the major capital expenses incurred during the year.

Income Features

Membership Fees were up by \$14K in comparison to the prior period. This could not have been achieved if not for the hard work put in by the club debt collector Mr. Peter Strain. Thank you for the mammoth effort put in by you.

Grant income has increased by \$25K in comparison to the prior period. All thanks to the efforts of Julie Isoardi and Alex Robynson, putting in a lot of time and effort to try secure more and more funding for our club.

Expense Features

The largest expense during the period has been the Picket fence which cost us \$37K during the period.

Coaching and Salaries have been the next largest expense during the period which amounted to over \$38K.

In conclusion the club has been able to withstand the challenges thrown at us by these uncertain times and we have had no debt, new capital purchases and a loyal membership to provide us with a solid foundation for the future from a financial perspective. I acknowledge and thank Mike Lee and Savi Illangamage for the continuous support with the finances over the period.

9 QLD CRICKET DELEGATES' REPORT

Report by Brendon Gibson

The relationship with Queensland Cricket had many facets this year mainly due to the many implications that COVID had on our game. The year started off promising with Queensland Cricket announcing an ongoing increase to Premier Grade clubs of \$20k per annum. This was welcomed by Souths given where our program of works is currently at.

Queensland Cricket underwent a large change during the year – driven by the uncertainty of COVID on the international schedule, reduce funding from Cricket Australia and the potential lack of crowds for the Domestic Season. Queensland Cricket put through a restructure that saw 34 positions leave the organisation in line with reduce funding from CQ (mainly driven from the dispute with Chanel Seven).

Queensland Cricket decided not to pass this reduction in funding through the affiliates (a decision we applauded), and chose to manage their finances much tighter than in the past. QC will also end up spending in excess of \$25m – mainly from Cricket Australian and the Queensland Government – on the Norths Facility at Shaw Road and Allan Border Oval.

The lack of crowds did not eventuate and Queensland Cricket are likely to post a surplus of \$4m last financial year. QC should be congratulated on this result.

Our view of this result however is into the long term. The club see no reason why this result should be continued into the future – leaving enough funding for QC to build up reserves but also generously funding affiliates to a much higher tune going forward. This is what Clayton and I will continue to pursue as we enter the QC AGM period.

I would like to thank Clayton for all his hard work this year – not only as a delegate – but also along with Corey Curran as the key Architect of our constitutional re-write. That you both for the hard work and dedication to the club.

After signing off last year, I was encouraged by our President to remain as a delegate.

The past year has been one of significant challenges, not the least in cricket.

The fact that Cricket Australia and Qld Cricket got a domestic, and international season completed is one of some amazement and assisted in ensuring the sound financial position the Association is at this time.

It is my understanding that the cash surplus position of Qld Cricket has improved markedly due to grant payments from Cricket Australia. If you remember, Qld Cricket previously carried the risk / reward of ticket sales for the Gabba (with little control over scheduling, teams etc).

When we agreed to the new financial model with Cricket Australia, we transferred that risk/reward to Cricket Australia in exchange for a more sound, predictable level of funding from media rights and other income sources.

This arrangement is now bearing fruit for the association and sees the game in good position.

We still, as an association, are the major stakeholders in the well performing (at business level at least)

Brisbane Heat and we cannot forget the positive impact that the Heat as a business has had on our finances,
particular at the time the Association was in a fairly dire financial state.

That being said, it is my role as a delegate to ensure that we hold the Association to account on how those surpluses are to be spent to ensure the ongoing financial stability of the game in Queensland.

Next year (2022-2023 season) is the 125th anniversary of both the Brisbane Grade Competition, and of the creation of South Brisbane District Cricket Club. I have already indicated to QC that I believe we should celebrate this fact with the other foundation clubs, Valley District and Toombul District.

I look forward to a huge party next year for us all.

5th Grade Captains Report:

Coming into the 20/21 season for Fifth Grade, there was a strong desire to replicate the previous seasons results. The previous season saw Fifths make it to both the one day and two day semi-finals which was a huge achievement. Whilst we didn't see the results we wanted to in those finals, we knew we had it in ourselves to carry the momentum through to the 20/21 season. The start of the season saw the playing group retaining some of those who played a part in the previous seasons success, where as there were many new faces to replace those who had climbed the grades off some quality performances and big preseason efforts. Staring with the ball was Anis Ahmed who took five wickets in the first innings to set us up nicely, needing to chase 215 for a first innings victory. This saw Hugo Malone craft a brilliant 67 to see us to victory, chasing the runs 7 down. That was the final two-day match of the year, and we went into the one-day games with some positive momentum. Despite Will Eberhardt's best efforts with the bat scoring 88, we went down again to Valleys in the first game. We rebounded well, securing two victories in the next two games again Wests and a particularly strong Redlands team.

The second half of the season started off with an unfortunate cancellation due to a COVID induced lockdown. Round 10 saw the return of the two-day games and a draw against one of the University teams, with Michael Lovell producing a 50. 
