



What commands can I give my Habitat thermostat with HomeLink using Alexa?

For Alexa to properly carry out your command, you will need to use the name listed in the Habitat HomeLink App for your Alexa App. This is the name you gave your Habitat thermostat in the Habitat HomeLink App. Please update the thermostat's name in the Alexa App so Alexa is correctly linked to the thermostat.

After it's connected, you will be able to verbally change thermostat modes, and set, lower, and raise the temperature on your Habitat thermostat. You will also be able to ask Alexa the room temperature, the thermostat's mode, and the thermostat's set point.

It is important to remember for Alexa to execute your commands correctly, it must be spoken to in a certain phrase manner. We have listed examples below of the correct way to execute the command functions. It also should be noted that when executing a command on your Alexa device there may be a slight delay for the command to be implemented on the unit depending on internet speeds.

For instance, in the following examples, let's say you've named your Habitat thermostat "bedroom."

Here are some examples of commands to give Alexa:

- "Alexa – Set bedroom to heat."
- "Alexa – Set bedroom to cool."
- "Alexa – Set bedroom to auto."
- "Alexa – Set bedroom to off".
- "Alexa – Set bedroom to 75 degrees."
- "Alexa – Raise (or increase) bedroom by 4 degrees."
- "Alexa – Lower (or decrease) bedroom by 2 degrees."
- "Alexa – What is the temperature in bedroom?"
- "Alexa – What is bedroom temperature?"
- "Alexa – What is bedroom set to?"

Function Notes:

Auto Mode Note: When using the Alexa App this function can only be utilized if your unit is capable of automatic changeover as a function.

Fan Only Mode Note: Alexa does not allow access to this system function.

Fahrenheit/Celsius Note: Alexa and your Habitat thermostat can function in either Fahrenheit or Celsius, however both Alexa and your Habitat thermostat should be set up in your preferred format.

To change degrees to Fahrenheit or Celsius on your Habitat thermostat, navigate to the Habitat HomeLink app and click User Settings. You can toggle between F/C.

To change degrees to Fahrenheit or Celsius on your Echo, navigate to the Alexa App and click Settings. Under Alexa Devices, find and click your Echo. Scroll down and toggle Metric Measurements to On for Celsius or Off for Fahrenheit.
