We Priests...

'Gatekeepers to the future that is opening up'

At the Chrism Mass recently Bishop Niall described priests as 'gatekeepers to a future that is opening up'. In this weekends Gospel the gatekeeper admits the Shepherd into the sheepfold. Elsewhere in the Scriptures Moses & John the Baptist were also gatekeepers of sorts. Moses stood at the edge of the promised land and gazed into it but never set foot in it. Perhaps we priests today are the same..we are gatekeepers to a future that is opening up but a future we may or may not enter. John the Baptist was the voice crying in the wilderness 'prepare a way for the Lord'. Priests too are called to do the ground work for a tomorrow that is in the Lord's hands. Karl Rahner was once described as 'a man of the day after tomorrow'. Isn't that who we priests are? -our lives and ministries point to the future, and when they do we are witnesses to Hope. Despite our diminishing numbers, our tiredness, our desire to cling to the fragments of the past, our disappointment at the lack of faith and practice today, etc. we are still a prophetic voice when we continue to proclaim the Gospel and minister to God's People. Every Baptism, wedding, funeral, celebration fo the Eucharist, school visit, pastoral visit of the sick, is an an act of Hope that declares that Christ Jesus is our Hope (Bishop Niall's motto). This is why the promotion of Vocations to Diocesan Priesthood is so important. This is why a year of vocations has just begun. It is statement of Hope that despite the challenges we face we will never give up on God's Love for us, the whole Church and the World.

To abandon ship on speaking of vocations would be a negation of Hope. New gatekeepers will always be necessary who will open up new pathways for our sisters and brothers as they journey into the Church of the future. The priest of the day after tomorrow will be a type of Sherpa rather than the expedition leader, helping a pilgrim people to navigate the often difficult terrain of life, accompanying them with the Gospel and trusting them to reach the summit. Today you and I can play our part by leaving aside our negativity and our fears for the future and instead be who we are called to be Hope fuelled gatekeepers to the future - earthenware jars containing a great treasure to be shared with all the Baptised.

On this vocations weekend I would humbly ask you to consider doing three simple things listed below to open the gate to the future that is opening up...

Vocation: Grace & Mission

"Our shared mission as Christians is to bear joyful witness wherever we find ourselves, through our actions and words, to the experience of being with Jesus and members of his community, which is the Church. That mission finds expression in works of material and spiritual mercy, in a welcoming and gentle way of life that reflects closeness, compassion and tenderness, in contrast to the culture of waste and indifference. By being a neighbour, like the Good Samaritan (cf. Lk 10:25-37), we come to understand the heart of our Christian vocation: to imitate Jesus Christ, who came to serve, not to be served (cf. Mk 10:45)."
