

Chunky crochet Sedge Stitch Scarf. Uk Crochet Terms



Abbreviations

Ch – chain

Sk - skip

St – stitch

Rep - repeat

Dc – double crochet

Htr – half treble crochet

Tr – treble crochet

My scarf measures approx 21cm wide x 215cm long (not including tassels) I used around 360g Stylecraft carnival tweed chunky yarn from my stash.

You will need 300-400g chunky weight yarn.

6mm crochet hook.

Start by making a chain of 33 (if you want to make a wider scarf or even blankets, you will need your base chain to be in multiples of 3)

Row 1 (foundation row) –

Sk 2 ch (counts as 1 dc) (1 htr, 1 tr) in next ch, *sk 2 ch, work (1dc, 1htr, 1tr) into next ch, rep from * to last 3 ch's, sk 2 ch and dc into last ch, turn.

Row 2 – Ch 1 (counts as 1 dc) work (1htr, 1tr) into first st, *sk 1 tr, 1htr. work (1dc, 1htr, 1tr) into top of dc from previous row, rep from * to last 3 sts, 1 dc into last st, turn.

Continue repeating Row 2 until you have your desired length. Fasten off and weave in those ends!



To add tassells simply cut 5 x 23cm strands per tassle, fold in half, pull loop through edge of scarf with a crochet hook and thread all ends through loop to secure, rep this evenly along edge of scarf.
