

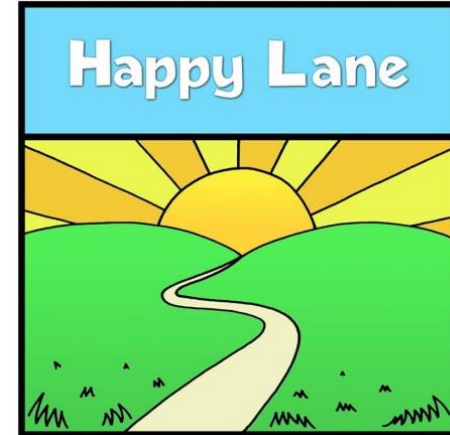

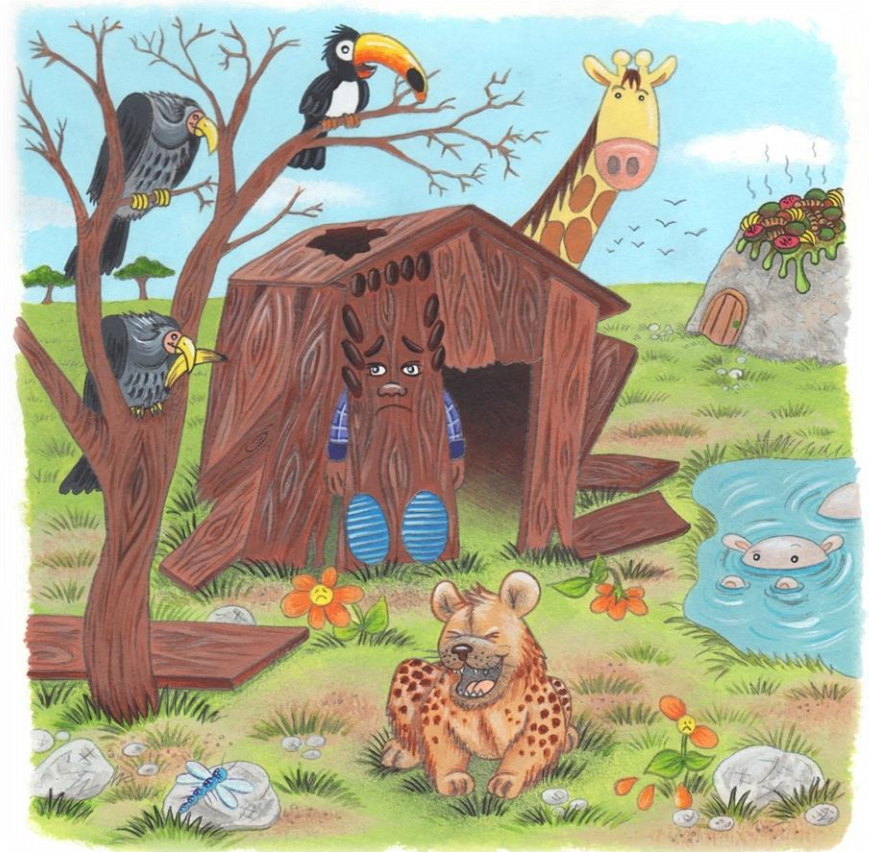
There is a land called Happy Lane where all the waste is used again. Paper, metal, plastic pots, Mai recycles lots and lots.
