September 17 10:30 am, "The Jewish High Holy Days: Shaving in the Shower, Artificial Intelligence, and Love" Rev. Kirk Ballin. Rosh Hashanah commemorates the creation of the world and marks the beginning of the Days of Awe, a 10-day period of introspection and repentance that culminates in the Yom Kippur Holy Day, also known as the Day of Atonement. Humanity and the Biosphere are at existential risk and the only hope is Love.

Rev. Ballin has been a UU Minister for 31 years and served 3 UU Congregations: Meadville, PA (1984-1987); Roanoke, VA (1987-1999); Lynchburg, VA (1999-2003). He worked as a Trauma Unit Chaplain with Carilion Health System, and Executive Director of the National Conference for Community-Roanoke and Justice - Roanoke Region. Currently, Kirk is Program Coordinator of AgrAbility Virginia, a joint USDA funded project of Virginia Tech and Easter Seals UCP NC/ VA, serving farmers and ranchers with disabilities in the Commonwealth of Virginia. He lives with his wife, Robin Poteet, a Salem, VA artist and teacher.

September 24, 10:30 am, "What Might Emerge: Embracing the Tapestry of Accountability". "Because I am in love with the America that does not yet exist," and that's how Unitarian Universalism is also. 
Lunch at Westminster Canterbury

Happy September! I am looking forward to cooler days of autumn and the wonderful events and activities that happen in our area this time of year. Our family will be sharing some special times with friends in the congregation through the upcoming months with items from the Auction Fundraiser in June. We're looking forward to cookouts and apple picking and pumpkin patches and backyard campfires. I hope your family has ways of making special memories through the upcoming season.

As we talk about changing seasons, I am also excited for this time of year in the church, especially in Religious Education. We officially kick off our new church year on September 10 with our Ingathering Water Service. This is a multigenerational service, so all ages will be in the sanctuary together. Starting September 17, our Children and Youth programming will be in full swing for the Fall/Winter term.

This year on Sunday mornings, our Preschool to 4th grade students will be using the Soul Matters curriculum again, as we do a deep dive into the values proposed by the Article II committee. Soul Matters is a hands-on, exploratory curriculum. We use multiple learning modalities including books, music, movement, arts and crafts, sensory experiences, and shared experiences to learn the values in this curriculum. The value we will be exploring in September is Welcome. We look forward to learning more about being Welcoming and creating a Welcoming space by studying:

- The Work of a Wider Welcome
- Welcoming Change
- Welcoming in the Work of Apology and Forgiveness

Our 5th to 8th graders will be trying out an exciting, hands-on, brand new curriculum called Building a Better World, a gamer-based curriculum that explores a world built on UU values and principles, from an RPG perspective. If you have a 9th grade+ youth, let's chat about options for them. Our infant nursery is available at all times.

We are currently looking for RE teachers, both volunteers and paid staff. If you are interested in learning more about what either of these options would look like (for either Lower or Upper RE), please reach out to DLE Courtney Sinha to discuss this further.

There will be new programming for adults this fall as well. A new Soul Matters cohort will be starting in September for in-person gatherings. Soul Matters Small Groups meet once per month. If you are interested in joining the in-person cohort, reach out to DLE Courtney Sinha for more information. There is also likely to be openings in one or more of the online cohorts as well, if that format works better for you. Reach out and we can talk about it further! Also in September, we will be offering a New to UU class. Beginning in October, we have an adult theology building class.

Finally, an all-ages Growing UU Families will start in October. This is an opportunity to learn more about what UU in the home can look like. We will touch on UU in the media, rituals, family activities, and more. Children are welcome and invited to participate alongside their adults.
