

Here we are in the wintry welcome of December. I wish you peace and delight during this busy season. We have an exciting month ahead of us in congregational life. I look forward to being with you during this time.

Our **Religious Education** classes will be a wonderful celebration of the theme of **Mystery** this month. It has been such a delight exploring our Unitarian Universalist values and principles at all ages and stages over the past few months. Thank you for sharing your children with us. Their energetic and inquisitive selves are such fun to be around!

This month, our younger Religious Education classes will continue with the **Soul Matters** curriculum as we explore the theme of Mystery. We will continue to use stories, activities, movement, mindfulness, and crafts to help us fully embrace the curriculum.

If you have a child in preschool to 1st grades or 2nd to 4th grades, here is what you can expect: **Soul Matters** is a hands-on, exploratory curriculum. We use multiple learning modalities including books, music, movement, arts and crafts, sensory experiences, and shared experiences to learn the values in this curriculum. The Value we will be exploring in December is Mystery. We will be studying and exploring:

- December 3 The Mystery of Our Amazing World
- December 10 Multigenerational Serving ALL AGES in the Sanctuary: No RE or Nursery this week.
- December 17 Noticing Mystery in the Ordinary
- December 24 AM The Mystery of the Returning Light
- December 24 PM Multigenerational Christmas Eve Service; Family Service (No RE or Nursery for this Service)
- December 31 NO RE OR NURSERY THIS WEEK. We will see you in January!

Our older kids (5th to 8th grades) will be continuing their look at gaming through a UU lens, as they work together at Building a Better World. In December, they will be exploring building a word with and without magical powers; superpowers; and special human powers; death and dying in real life and in their world; and the economics of their world compared with scarcity and abundance in the real world.

Finally, if you have a youth 9th grade or above, let's chat about options for them. Our infant nursery is available at all times, except where noted above.
