

# Video Workshop with Allan Kirk by your Side

# Controlling the Video

I have kept everything I do in the video, so you see my work from start to finish in full. I wanted to do it this way, but you should consider how you use the video

- Fast forward through steps if you think you have the idea. To help you I have indicated the position (in time) of each step of the video. For example if you have traced you might not want to watch all the drawing step.
  - Pause to look more closely at sections
- **Rewind** to go back to a point in time that you want to see again
- **Stop** You may create your own work over time, even weeks, stop the video, note where you are, and pick up from there when you want

### Key steps in the Video

Total running time 2 hours 6 minutes

Composition starts at 9 mins 42secs

Drawing starts at11 mins 27 secs

Masking Fluid starts at 44mins 20 seconds

First watercolour wash at 51 mins and 20 secs

Second watercolour wash starts at 1 hour 5 mins 30 secs

Third watercolour wash starts at 1 hr 24 mins 20 secs

Finalising starts at 1 hour 41 mins

## Some Tips and Techniques

### **Drawing**

- Start inside and work outwards
- Keep the pen or pencil moving, work quickly
- Draw what you see not what you think

#### Watercolour

- Step by step washes
- Work light to dark and top to bottom
- Mix colours on the paper whenever you can

# **Suggested Materials List**

Paper – Watercolour paper. I used Bockingford NOT 200lb (425gsm) 22X28cm. I used a full 29 x 42cm sheet, leaving lots of white paper around. Pen – Waterproof black pen. I used Unipin with a point size of 0.3

### Brushes -

- A big brush of any kind for wetting the paper first.
- Size 12, 8,6,4 2,1. I used Sable and my smallest two sizes are rigger brushes
   Paint It is OK to use your normal watercolours, and substitute colours if you prefer, but I used
  - Cobalt Blue
  - Prussian Blue
  - Permanent Magenta or Winsor Violet
  - Cobalt Violet
  - Burnt Umber
  - Burnt Sienna
  - Raw Sienna
  - Cadmium Orange
  - Alizarin Crimson
  - Cobalt Turquoise Light
  - Winsor Lemon

### Miscellaneous

- hogs hair (scrubbing brush)
- Masking Fluid
- Rubber tipped colour shaper (to apply masking fluid)

### **Colour Mixing**

Wherever possible mix the colours on the paper.

#### First wash

All colours, except green, are mixed on the paper

- Raw Sienna
- Burnt Sienna
- Cobalt Violet
- Cobalt Blue
- Green -
  - Light green Yellow and Prussian Blue
  - Dark green -Prussian Blue and Burnt Sienna

### **Colour Mixing**

Colour mixing in second and third washes based on existing mixes in pallet. See video for details
