## **Controlling the Video**

I have kept everything I do in the video, so you see my work from start to finish in full. I wanted to do it this way, but you should consider how you use the video.

- Fast forward through steps if you think you have the idea. To help you I have indicated the position (in time) of each step of the video. For example if you have traced, you might not want to watch all the drawing step.
  - Pause to look more closely at sections.
  - Rewind to go back to a point in time that you want to see again.
- Stop. You may create your own work over time, even weeks. Stop the video, note where you are, and pick up from there when you want.

### Key steps in the Video

Total running time 1 hours 01minutes

Composition starts at 2 mins 30 secs

Drawing starts at 7 mins 16 secs

Masking Fluid starts at 14 mins 41 secs.

First watercolour wash at 21 mins 50 seconds

Second watercolour wash starts at 34 mins 32 secs

Third watercolour wash starts at 42 mins 50 secs

Finalising starts at 1 hour 19 mins

### Some Tips and Techniques

#### Drawing

- Start inside and work outwards
- Keep the pen or pencil moving, work quickly
- Draw what you see not what you think

#### Watercolour

- Step by step washes
- Work light to dark and top to bottom
- Mix colours on the paper whenever you can

### **Suggested Materials List**

Paper – Watercolour paper. I used arches rough 140lb (300gsm) 28X38cm.

Pencil – 4B

**Putty Eraser** .

Brushes -

- A big brush of any kind for wetting the paper first.
- Size 12, 8,6,4 2,1. I used Sable and my smallest two sizes are rigger brushes

Paint – It is OK to use your normal watercolours, and substitute colours if you prefer, but I used

- Ultramarine Blue
- Permanent Magenta or Winsor Violet
- Cobalt Violet
- Burnt Umber
- Burnt Sienna
- Raw Sienna
- Cadmium Orange
- Cadmium Red

#### Miscellaneous

- hogs hair (scrubbing brush)
- Masking fluid and rubber tipped colour shaper for application

### **Colour Mixing**

Wherever possible mix the colours on the paper.

#### First wash

- French ultramarine Blue
- Burnt Sienna
- Cobalt Violet
- Darker shade for house and wall French Ultramarine
   Blue and Burnt Umber and Permanent Magenta
