Prayer Point Focus

Leader's Lesson Overview

- The purpose of this guide is to give you a direction. Use the methods that work for you and your group. Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you as you use this. Pray and listen and He will lead you.
- Prayer is the most important part of Kingdom Kids.
- Understanding who we are praying to is fundamental. Jesus is so wonderful and powerful that He does not have only one name, but many.
 - Psalm 24:8 *Who is this King of glory? The Lord strong and mighty, the Lord mighty in battle.*
 - John 14:1 *Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.*
- He is our Father and wants His children to partner with Him in the Kingdom through prayer.

Preparation

Read through the lesson. Prepare the craft to go with the names of Jesus. You could ask the YAKKs (Youth Assistants 4 Kingdom Kids) to help.

Who is the King?



This is the basic format of meetings. You can use whatever works for you.

1. Come Into His Presence

MEMORY VERSE

OR *(Behold what manner of love the Father has given unto us, that we should be called the (children) of God!)*

2. Enter the Gates (opening prayers)

Begin with a prayer of thanksgiving.

3. Prayers for the Body

Let the children know that a main part of Kingdom Kids is supporting the church in prayer. Their prayers are very important!

Pray for the pastor and the church service. Ask for God's spirit to lead and to guide.

4. Prayer Requests and Praise Reports

Spend some time asking children if they have needs to pray about or if they have some praise reports. (Testimonies of something awesome God has done in your life)



5. Prayer Point: Who is the King?

Think of someone that is very special. (Not family members or Jesus) Maybe a famous actor or singer? A president or the Queen of England? Why are they so special?

How would you feel if they called you and asked to come visit you? Would you go? Discuss.

How would you feel, if you knew the King of Kings, the Creator of the Universe called and asked you to visit Him?

He did! He is calling children all across the world to visit Him and talk to Him. And, he wants to meet with YOU!

So, Who is This King?

Prayer Point time should not exceed 15 minutes. The more involved and active the kids can be, the better. Lead them in discovering that Jesus is the King of Kings, so big, powerful, and wonderful that He doesn't have just one name. Ask leading questions. Be creative, but don't take the focus off of the topic.

K Kids and KKITs:

Songs: King of Kings and Jesus Name Above All Names



You could listen to the songs or sing them together and “capture” the names of Jesus in the songs. Capture them onto a white board, cards or something so the kids can see them. They will use them in their project.

Here are some other scriptures to capture the names of Jesus:

Genesis 1:2 (IV), Isaiah 9:6, 3 Nephi 4:47

Project Ideas

Use the many names of God to cover a cutout of a cross, poster or banner.

Group project: Each child could choose one or two captured names that speaks to him/her. They can write that word on everyone's banner including theirs. The finished banners will have all of the names of Jesus.

Make sure there is one to hang in the classroom with everyone's word for Jesus. They will use this later.

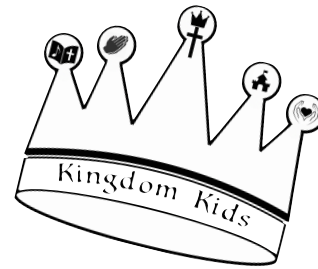
