Prayers for the Church

Let the children know that a main part of Kingdom Kids is supporting the church in prayer. Their prayers are very important! Pray for the pastor and the church service. Ask for God's spirit to lead and to guide. If you using this at home, you can still pray for your church and pastor.

Prayer Requests and Praise Reports

Spend some time asking children if they have needs to pray about or if they have some praise reports. (Testimonies of something awesome God has done in your life)

Pray for those needs or thank God for His blessings.

Prayer Point: Who is the King?



Think of someone that is very special. (Not family members or Jesus) Maybe a famous actor or singer? Your favorite quarterback, pitcher or YouTube star? Why are they so special? How would you feel if they called you and asked to come visit you? Would you go? Discuss.

How would you feel, if you knew the King of Kings, the Creator of the Universe called and asked you to visit Him?

He did! He is calling children all across the world to visit Him and talk to Him. And, he wants to meet with YOU!

So, Who is This King?

Prayer Point time should not exceed 15 minutes. The more involved and active the kids can be, the better. Lead them in discovering that Jesus is the King of Kings, so big, powerful, and wonderful that He doesn't have just one name. Ask leading questions. Be creative, but don't take the focus off of the topic.

Who does He say He is? Here are some hints to get them thinking. Let them think of names of Jesus / God that they have heard in the past. (**See the attached worksheet on page 6**)

Songs: King of Kings, Jesus Name Above All Names, You are Holy (Prince of Peace)

These songs have many names of Jesus. You could listen to the songs or sing them together and "capture" the names of Jesus in the songs. Capture them onto a white board, cards or something so the kids can see them. They will use them in their project.

Project Ideas

Use the many names of God and Jesus to cover a cutout of a cross, poster or banner.

Group project: Each child could choose one or two captured names that speaks to him/her. They can write that word on everyone's banner including theirs. The finished banners will have all of the names.

Make sure there is one to hang in the classroom with everyone's word or phrase. They will use this later.



Spend some time in prayer thanking Him for being so big and so mighty. And even though He is all of these names, He still knows and loves you. He even knows how many hairs are on your head!! How amazing is that?

Prayer Challenge

When you pray, remember that He is your father, you are His child and He loves you very much. Since you are a child of the King, you can come talk to Him anytime and anywhere.

Go Deeper

During each time of prayer, focus on another name or attribute of Jesus. Do you have a testimony about Him being like a Shepherd? What does that look like in real life? You could lead the children in thanking Him for being their King, Shepherd, _______. Discover His different attributes as you go throughout life.
