Prayer Point Focus Leader's Lesson Overview

Preparation

Weapons of Warfare - Power in Praise

This is the basic format of meetings. You can use whatever works for you.



Come Into His Presence

Begin with songs, scripture and the Kingdom Kid pledge. MEMORY VERSE Psalm 18:3

SCRIPTURE STORY - 2 Chronicles 20:21-23 Jehoshaphat



Enter the Gates (opening prayers)

Open with prayers of thanksgiving and praise. Praise is giving God the glory and focusing on who He is and what He does.

Prayers for the Church and Family

Pray for the service and the pastor. Pray for strength, courage to speak the truth.

Pray for the congregation and those that need to hear God's word today.

Pray for protection from the enemy. Pray on your armor and "suffer us not to be led into temptation..."

Other Prayers

Invite God's presence and ask him to be your teacher today.

Follow the Spirit's lead during this time of prayer.



The Bible story of Paul and Silas in jail in Acts 16 is a good example of the power of praise. What happened when Paul and Silas praised God by praying and singing hymns?




