Leader's Lesson Overview

Enter the Gates (opening prayers)

Open with a prayer of thanksgiving. Ask God to send His spirit to teach today.

Prayers for the Church

If meeting during church, say prayers for the pastor, the music, the congregation. Invite the children to pray that God's spirit would lead and guide each person.

Prayer Requests and Praise Reports

Remember who you are praying to. The mighty God who created the heavens, the earth and

Prayer Point: Talking to the King

When you get together with friends, what do you do? Do you talk to them?

What do you talk about? Did you know that you can talk about those things with God?

What do you think this scripture means?

Phil 4:6

Be afflicted for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.

Activity

- If possible, divide the children into groups of 2 or 3. Ask the kids to find someone they <u>don't</u> know really well. If this is at home, that won't be possible. Give them a minute or two to just chat with each other.
- Then, divide them into groups of 2 or 3 with people they <u>do</u> know. Give them a minute or two to chat.
- Come back together and discuss if it was easier to talk with someone they knew or didn't know.
- How do you get to know that person better? By talking to them more!!
- How do you get to know God more?

Who is He? Who are you?

Here is how I teach this part, but feel free to do you your own thing:

- Who am I? point thumb to self Who are you? (let the kids give some answers)
- I am the dust of the earth but loved by God, same as you!
 I am one person out of 7.7 billion but God knows how many hairs are on my head, same for you!
- Who is the great I AM? point thumb to the heavens.
- Remember the names we discovered last time? (let kids remember those names)
- He is all of those names! So mighty and wonderful, and yet, He wants a relationship with YOU!
- How do we talk to the great I AM? Pray!
- Put letters on left hand fingers to spell "I PRAY"




Names, Names, Names!!

Remember those names we talked about? (Use the poster you made last time) What do you think it means for Jesus to be your King? Your Savior? Your Shepherd?

You could even add some more names or attributes like Provider, Comforter, Healer to the poster.

Spend a little time in prayer thanking God for being your king, creator, shepherd...



Leader: if you have a a short testimony of an attribute of God, such as Provider, Comforter share it with the children. Ask them if they have testimonies to share.

Private Prayer Time

Remind the kids that they can talk to God about any thing, any time and any where.

If at home, they could find a cozy corner to pray. If at church, you can all just bow your heads and have some quiet time. It might be helpful to have some soft instrumental music <u>like this</u> playing in the background.

Tell the kids that we are going to spend a little bit of time talking to God. You can talk about anything you want. Maybe you have a question for Him. Maybe you just want to tell Him you love him. Maybe you are sorry about something. Maybe you want to thank him for something.

You will know when they get restless that the time is up. As you do this more often, the time they pray will be longer.

Start a K Kids Treasure Book

- You could copy the Scripture and Song pages for each child to have their own notebook. They could even decorate the cover to say My Treasure Book or something like that.
- Any other worksheets or other treasures that you learn along the way can also go in the notebook.
- There could be a section for prayer requests and answers to prayer. There could be a section for testimonies.
