**bian** small, little (some prefer to spell this word **byhan**)  
**blou** blue  
**brâs** big, large  
**brav** fine  
**bryntyn** noble; excellent  
**clor** mild  
**comolek** cloudy  
**dâ** good (**yn tâ** well)  
**drog** bad; naughty  
**du** black; overcast (of sky / weather)  
**glas** bright / strongly coloured in blue-green part of spectrum  
(a common adjective, but not a general word for blue or green)  
**glëb** wet  
**gwag** empty  
**gwer** green  
**gwydn** white  
**gwynsak** windy  
**howlek** sunny  
**leun** full  
**lowen** happy  
**medhel** soft  
**melen** yellow; blond  
**pedrak** square  
**poos** heavy  
**rial** royal; excellent  
**rônd** (or **rownd**) round  
**rudh** red (also used for 'brown' where context is clear)  
**saw** safe; intact (this word also means 'except' and 'but')  
**scav** light (weight)  
**sad** serious (be careful not to confuse with **trist**)  
**sëgh** dry  
**spladn** splendid; excellent  
**sqwith** tired  
**tanow** thin  
**terrys** broken  
**tew** thick; fat; dense  
**tobm** hot, warm  
**trist** sad  
**uthyk** dreadful  
**yagh** well (healthy)  
**yêyn** cold, cool
