

*Exercise One*

**Crysten ha Tôny a wra debry ly gans dew gothman, Jenefer ha Mathew, in boosty ogas dhe Redrudh. Anjy a vydn debry pytsas. Pandr'usons y ow leverel?**

Crysten	<b>Tôny, a wrêta debry udn pytsa? Pò onen genama vy: hanter, hanter?</b>
Tôny	<b>Nâ, me a vydn debry udn pytsa. Gwag ov vy. Ytho gans try happa.</b>
Jenefer	<b>My a wra radna udn pytsa genes, Crysten. Gans dew gappa martesen.</b>
Mathew	<b>Me a vydn debry udn pytsa, ha peswar cappa ganso.</b>
Crysten	<b>Peswar! Ha nyns osta tew màn!</b>
Mathew	<b>In gwir. Yth esof vy ow marhogeth deg kîlomêter pùb jorna wàr dhywros saya.</b>
Tôny	<b>Py lies cappa eus dhe gafos?</b>
Mathew	<b>Naw. Pepperoni, hãm, kig yar, scavellow cronak, greun olew, onyon, pînaval, ÿs wheg, ha keus addys.</b>
Jenefer	<b>Hãm ha scavellow dhe ny martesen, Crysten?</b>
Crysten	<b>Dâ lowr.</b>
Tôny	<b>My a wra kemeres pepperoni, scavellow, ha greun olew.</b>
Mathew	<b>Pòr dhâ. Ha my a wra dôwys pepperoni, kig yar, onyon, ha keus addys.</b>
Crysten	<b>Ha wosa hedna, <i>deg</i> kîlomêter dywros, ha deg kîlomêter unweyth arta!</b>

*New grammar*

Here are all the present/future tense forms of **gwil** that forms *future* tenses for other verbs. This is an alternative to using **mydnas** for the same job. We use the forms preceded by interrogative particle **a** for questions, and the forms preceded by negative statement particle **ny** (a short form of **nyns**) for negative statements. Note that initial w in these words is silent.

<b>a wrav vy?</b>	will I [do]?
<b>a wreth jy? or a wrêta?</b>	will you [do]?
<b>a wra ev?</b>	will he [do]? <i>or</i> will it [do]? (masculine reference)
<b>a wra hy?</b>	will she [do]? <i>or</i> will it [do]? (feminine reference)
<b>a wra + subject noun?</b>	will [subject noun] [do]?
<b>a wren ny?</b>	will we [do]?
<b>a wrewgh why?</b>	will you [do]? (plural or polite)
<b>a wrowns y?</b>	will they [do]?
<b>ny wrav vy</b>	I not [do]
<b>ny wreth jy or ny wrêta</b>	you will not [do]
<b>ny wra ev</b>	he will not [do] <i>or</i> it will not [do] (masculine reference)
<b>ny wra hy</b>	she will not [do] <i>or</i> it will not [do] (feminine reference)
<b>ny wra + subject noun</b>	[subject noun] will not [do]
<b>ny wren ny</b>	we will not [do]
<b>ny wrewgh why?</b>	you will not [do] (plural or polite)
<b>ny wrowns y?</b>	they will not [do]
