Yth esof vy orth agas praisya.	I am praising you (pl).
Yth esof vy orth aga fraisyा.	I am praising them.
Yma ev orth ow fraisyा.	He is praising me.

Dha weles (colloquially Da weles) is short for Me a wra dha weles ‘I’ll be seeing you.’
