- A Vegetables must be correctly named in variety, or points will be lost. Exhibitor is responsible for adding variety name/s to entry tags when the tags are picked up
- B All entries must be grown by the exhibitor
- C All fruits and vegetables will be judged according to the STANDARDS OF PERFECTION issued by the Ministry of Agriculture 250-398-4500

- 1 Beans, any variety, 3 pods
- 2 Beets, 3 roots
- 3 Broccoli, 1 head or lateral shoots
- 4 Brussels sprouts, 3 specimens
- 5 Cabbage, green, 1 head
- 6 Cabbage, red, 1 head
- 7 Carrots, long, over 7", 3 roots
- 8 Carrots, intermediate, 4"-7", 3 roots
- 9 Carrots, short, under 4", 3 roots
- 10 Cauliflower, 1 head
- 11 Celery, 1 specimens
- 12 Corn, sweet, 2 ears, 1/3 husk removed
- 13 Cucumbers, long English, 1 specimens
- 14 Cucumbers, slicing, 1 specimens
- 15 Cucumbers, pickling, 3 specimens
- 16 Kale, one plant
- 17 Lettuce, leaf, one bunch
- 18 Onions green, bunching, 3 onions
- 19 Onions, any type, 2 specimens
- 20 Peas, any single variety, 3 pods
- 21 Peas, sugar snap variety, 3 pods
- 22 Peppers, any variety, 3 specimens
- 23 Potatoes, red, 3 - 5 specimens
- 24 Potatoes, white, 3 - 5 specimens
- 25 Potatoes, other, 3 - 5 specimens
- 26 Pumpkins, 1 specimen
- 27 Squash - zucchini, 12" and under, 1 specimen
