A few reminders from your Pairings Administrators:

- Please sign up by 5:00 p.m. the Thursday before the play day.
- When you sign up you will receive a confirmation email. Please save this email. If you don't receive an email, you may not have completed the sign up. Go into Total-E and check to see that you are signed up.
- Tee Times will be created in Total-E by the golf department on Friday.
- If you signed up and don't receive a tee time, please call the Pairings Administrator listed on the WGA website Play Day Information/Pairings tab.
- If you forget to sign up or need to cancel you must call the Pairings Administrator listed on the WGA website Play Day Information/Pairings tab by Monday at 5:00 p.m.
- If you add after Monday 5:00 p.m. no guarantees are made that you will get a tee time as that is determined based on play day format, player handicap, and is up to the discretion of the Pairings Administrator.
- Scorecards are printed on Tuesday so it is more difficult to make changes after Monday night.
- The Pairings Administrators make the changes to the scorecards on Wednesday afternoons around 3:00 p.m. Any changes after that time will not be reflected on the scorecards.

SCORES FOR A HOLE NOT COMPLETED

Adjustment of Hole Scores

Q. I started a hole but did not complete it. What score do I post?

A. When the format of play allows you to start a hole but not complete it, the score recorded for handicap purposes is your most likely score, equal to:

- The number of strokes already taken on the hole, plus
- Any penalty strokes incurred during the hole, plus
- The number of strokes you would most likely require to complete the hole.

A most likely score is a reasonable assessment made by you based on the score you are most likely to make from that spot more than half the time. The following guidelines should be used to determine a most likely score:

- If the ball lies on the putting green no more than 5 feet from the hole, add one stroke.
- If the ball lies between 5 feet and 20 yards from the hole, add 2 or 3 additional strokes depending on the position of the ball, difficulty of the green and your ability.
- If the ball lies more than 20 yards from the hole, add 3 or 4 additional strokes depending on the position of the ball, difficulty of the green and your ability.

(Rule 3.3, Rules of Handicapping)
