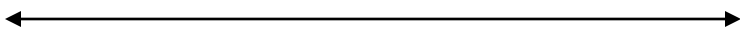

### Adjustment of Holes Not Played for Handicapping Scores

Last month I covered (Rule 3.3, Rules of Handicapping. "Scores for a Hole Not Completed". This Month it's:

### Adjustment of Holes Not Played

Q. I did not play a hole. What score to do I post?

Handicap scoring for holes Not Completed and Not Played differ.

A. When a hole is not played, for example, due to darkness or construction, the score recorded for handicap purposes is net par, (equal to par plus any handicap strokes you are entitled to receive) based on your Course Handicap.

For example: A Player with a Course Handicap of 21 receives 1 handicap stroke on all 18 holes and 2 handicap strokes on holes with the stroke difficulty index of 1 through 3 on the scorecard.

On a par-3 hole with a stroke difficulty index of 17, the player's net par score is 4 (3 + 1). (Rule 3.2, Rules of Handicapping)

**Please note above, you take "Net Par" which is not necessarily your "MAX"**
