World Day Against Trafficking in Persons 2022

The 30th July is an annual event to raise awareness and increase prevention of people trafficking and modern day slavery. Trafficking in persons is a serious crime and a violation of human rights.

Thousands of men, women and children fall victim to traffickers every year. This often happens as a result of them being misled to believe that they are being taken to work that will make their family better off, or through force or being kidnapped. Victims lose their rights and are forced to work, often doing hard labour or prostitution, but receive no payment. Additionally, they also frequently have their documents taken from them and are threatened with punishment if they should try to escape.
