Fr José Romero O.A.R., Parish Priest of The Holy Family, Honiton

Is away on holiday in Spain from 13th August to 15th September to see his family and celebrate his 25th anniversary of his Religious Profession. During his absence Fr Hugh Corrigan O.A.R. will say the weekly Masses at St Rita's and Fr Frank will celebrate the Sunday Masses at The Holy Family, Honiton.

27 August, St Monica (331 - 387)

She was born at Thagaste in Africa of a Christian family. She was married young, to Patricius, and among her children was Augustine. He had a brilliant intellect and uncertain morals and his wayward spiritual career saw him at one time a Manichee and then a Neoplatonist. With many tears she prayed unceasingly to God for his conversion and her prayers were answered shortly before she died. She had a deep faith and outstanding virtue and is a wonderful example of a Christian mother.

28 August, St Augustine – Bishop & Doctor (354 - 430)

Augustine was born in Thagaste in Africa of a Berber family. He was brought up a Christian but left the Church early and spent a great deal of time seriously seeking the truth, first in the Manichaean heresy, which he abandoned on seeing how nonsensical it was, and then in Neoplatonism, until at length, through the prayers of his mother and the teaching of St Ambrose of Milan, he was converted back to Christianity and baptised in 387, shortly before his mother's death. Augustine had a brilliant legal and academic career, but after his conversion he returned home to Africa and led an ascetic life in Community with some of his friends. He gave them a Rule that has been followed by numerous Orders and Congregations of women and men over the centuries up to the present time. He was elected Bishop of Hippo and spent 34 years looking after his flock, teaching them, strengthening them in the faith and protecting them strenuously against the errors of the time. He wrote an enormous amount and left a permanent mark on both philosophy and theology. His Confessions, as dazzling in style as they are deep in content, are a landmark of world literature. He was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Boniface VIII in 1308
