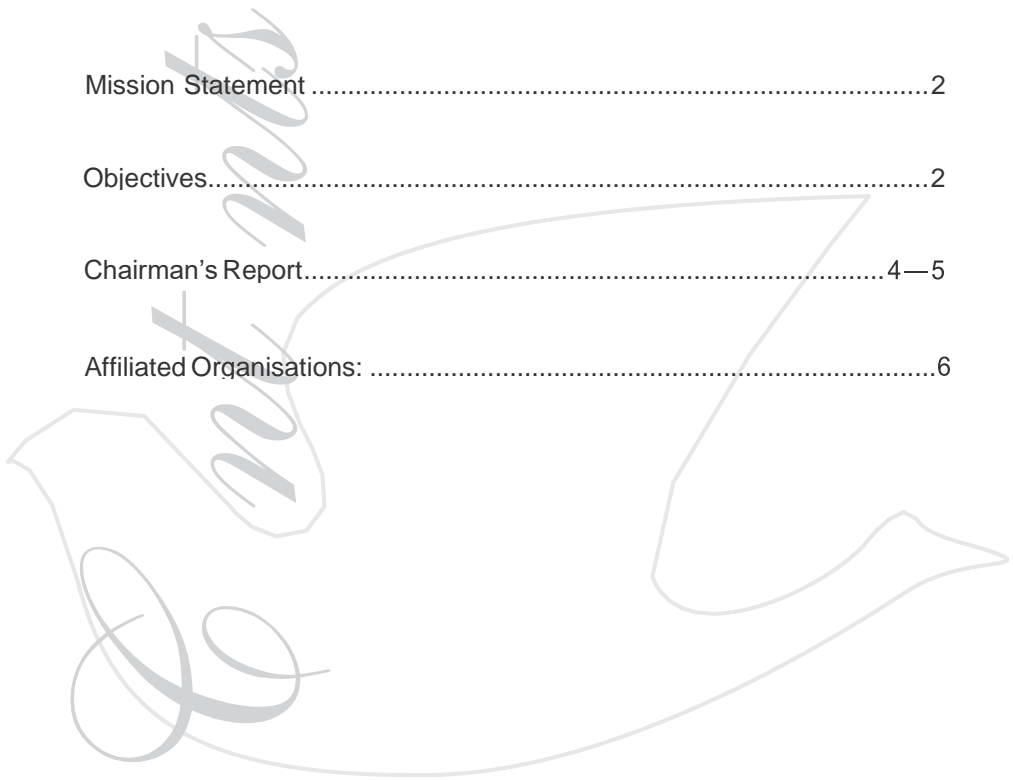

- Measures to prevent primary impairment.
- Measures for the early detection and prompt and efficient treatment of persons who are or may become cerebral palsied.

CHAIRMANS REPORT

Introduction

NAPCP managed to continue its work in the past year, despite functioning in an unpredictable landscape. Like all other non-profit organisations, severe financial constraints are still being experienced. Decreased funding opportunities and available funds has seen a number of NGO's severely scale back their services, or close down completely.

Fundraising has become increasingly difficult and as a main source of income, this has had severe repercussions for our Association and most of our affiliates. Despite this it was decided to award the grants, which are annually allocated by NAPCP, early in 2023.

A list of affiliated organisations is provided in the Annual report. The members comprise representatives of Cerebral Palsy Associations and other service providers for persons with cerebral palsy, including special schools and care centres.

Affiliated organisations provide important services at provincial and local level. These services include education, clinics, workshops, social and vocational counselling, residential care, and transport. Unfortunately, due to severe financial limitations, some of our provincial offices had to close their doors during the previous and this past year.

Our affiliates and their staff members are dedicated in providing services to those with cerebral palsy and their families and for this, we are very thankful. We value their input into our activities, particularly the participation of those affiliates who attend our annual conference.

Activities

Historically, affiliated organisations host the Annual National Conferences on a rotational basis. A General Meeting, formerly called a Business Meeting, is held during the course of the Conference. Papers relating to cerebral palsy matters are invited and CPD points are awarded.

The Annual National CP Conference was held as a Hybrid Symposium on 14 October 2022. The Symposium was hosted by Forest Town School and the theme was "Enablism" – A focus on Cerebral Palsy beyond the Schooling Environment. It was a very successful event in terms of excellent presenters, however disappointing in terms of attendance.

Meetings

The Executive Committee (Chairman, Vice Chairman and Treasurer), and the Management Committee of the NAPCP held regular virtual meetings in the time between the annual Business Meetings to expedite the work of the organisation.
