

Lenten Practices

All the Fridays of Lent are days of days of abstinence for Catholics aged 14 and up. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are also days of abstinence but are also days of fasting. Abstinence simply means abstaining from eating meat. Abstinence laws consider that meat comes only from animals, such as, chickens, cows sheep or pigs. Birds are also considered meat. Moral theologians have traditionally taught that we should abstain from all animal derived products, except foods such as, gelatin, butter, cheese and eggs. Fish, both salt and freshwater species, are permitted, as well as amphibians, reptiles and shellfish.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Above all, common sense should prevail. For example, the physically or mentally ill, pregnant or nursing women or those with diabetes are exempt. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
