In this report, you will read about some of our key achievements in 2022, but you will also appreciate how EM is laying the foundation for an ambitious effort for 2023 and beyond.



It was moderated by Benard Cankara, Executive Director, Efficacy Methodology, and attracted participants from Uganda and from across the region.



National Survey Report on Oil & Gas Production in Uganda. This survey was prompted by the EU's resolution on September 15th to halt oil & gas production in Uganda. An online approach was used to generate data from Ugandan respondents using our official social-media pages. Subsequently, the survey ran on twitter, LinkedIn, Facebook and on EM Website, A of 1,351 adult total respondents participated in the survey. descriptive statistics was used to analyze, interpret and present the results. Methodological constraint was mainly attributed to the small number of respondents.



5.7 EM in the Mainstream Media



6.0 The Local Communities for Inclusive Development

Progress towards development and fighting poverty continue to face multitudes of challenges. Governments across Africa are increasingly finding it difficult to understand the local community changes and direct funding appropriately. The community is the major unit for development because it engrains human needs and rights, hence, understanding community changes is critical for appropriate developmental initiatives. This year we have commenced one research on community development and also understood policy dialogues.

A renowned scholar Balyejjusa, in his 2009 work, suggested that wellbeing can only be achieved when the ideal needs are gratified. Therefore, community members as a unit for development must first understand their needs and rights so that they can collectively work towards achieving it. Subsequently, government programmes and initiatives ought to be developed from the collective community needs. Further, governments should be interested in nurturing human or social capital within the communities to support a structure necessary to sustain the developmental agenda. Notably, these can only be effective if both the political and economic will are congruent to the community needs. Poverty would not have persisted on the African continent if leadership and the politics were right.

Unfortunately, Africa has suffered from repressive, less focused and miss diagnosed policies that lack facts. This has resulted in corruption and misappropriation of funds, hence, exacerbating inefficiency in health, education and social welfare at the grassroots.

In 2023, we will focus on linking the grassroot issues to the mainstream government policy formulation process and accelerate research. We are convinced that community voices are critical for development. Thus, our community engagement and research will contribute directly to bridging this gap.

7.0 Impact of Our Work



Our parameters of research, policy and evaluation fit into the core of what forms the right public policy decision. Thus, we are extremely focused on building an environment that will allow effective integration of data usage in mainstream public policy decision making in Uganda and Africa.


