SUMMARY

Enclosed are the proposed water and sewer rates that Laurel and I drafted together after the last meeting (Water Y1 and Sewer A). I have also provided a summary of our current utility rates, customer user totals, average usage, and a few rate comparisons, as well of the "next steps" should this move forward. If you have any questions, please email me so I can prepare a written response for the upcoming meeting.

ALL PROPOSED RATES:

- → Produce a balanced budget that meets the required revenue of \$602,500 for water and \$617,800 for sewer.
- → Generate at least 65% of the budgeted revenues from the base rates to help ensure operational security.
- → Do not include utility tax, which is an additional 6% on top of the base and usage rate.

NEXT STEPS

- **1.** No Action postpone effective date for rate changes to January 2023, pending further revisions and review leaving existing utility rates in place until that time.

WATER RATES

The Town has a total of 701 water users, 600 residential and 101 commercial, 313 users in-town and 388 out-of-town.

RATE STRUCTURE

I am recommending that we continue to use our existing water rate structure which consists of the method of increasing base rates based on meter size. I believe this has merit as larger meters have greater flow capacity and can put more strain on the water system which is summarized in a chart below. This table shows the gallons per minute (gpm) for each meter size, as well as the flow increase percentages and average percentage of rate increase between meter sizes (per nine comparison cities) compared to the Town's.

WATER RATES

As a result of having one rate for all water users regardless of town-limits location, rates must increase approximately 21% for in-town users to compensate for the decrease for out-of-town users; therefore, a 5-year adjustment plan is being proposed in order to ease the financial impact on in-town users. By year five, the Town will have one rate model for all users, regardless of where they live. Note that these percentages may fluctuate due to unknown factors like inflation or an increase in users.

- **Year 1**: 5.00% increase to in-town rates and 4.25% decrease to out-of-town rates *In-town excess rate remains unchanged to lessen the impact to those users.*
- Year 2: 5.00% increase to in-town rates and 3.50% decrease to out-of-town rates
- Year 3: 5.00% increase to in-town rate and 4.00% decrease to out-of-town rates
- Year 4: 5.00% increase to in-town rate and 4.00% decrease to out-of-town rates
- Year 5: 1.00% increase to in-town rates and 1.74% decrease to out-of-town rates

SEWER RATES

The Town has a total of 410 sewer users, 331 residential and 79 commercial; 304 users in-town and 106 out-of-town.

RATE STRUCTURE

In order to protect customers against paying additional sewer charges for warm weather activities such as watering lawns, washing cars, landscaping, gardening, and filling pools, we will continue to use the winter average for sewer rate water consumption.

- → A winter-average usage will be calculated for each customer on an annual basis to determine the **fixed rate** to apply to each individual customer **for the following year**. Winter-averages will be adjusted annually based on actual usage from the prior year's winter quarter and changes will be reflected on the first billing statement in January.
- → The calculation period will be for the months of December of the prior year through February of the current year. (eg. Sewer bills for January 1, 2022 December 31, 2022, will be calculated based on the winter-average of actual water usage during the usage months of December 2020, January 2021, and February 2021.)
- → An account with a zero read in any of the calculation period months *can* be billed for the median average of the user class, per month until actual usage is established.

- 326 (or 80%) of our customers would pay only the monthly minimum, i.e. Base Rate (274 res/52 com)
- Based on the usage factor, only 84 (or 20%) of our users would pay for any excess usage (27 com/57 res)
- 41 (or 10%) of our users will have a higher monthly bill (8 com/33 res) between \$5 and \$2,700 per month. 15 users between \$5-\$50, 18 between \$51-\$250, and 8 >\$251 more per month.
- The maximum monthly bill is \$600.65 for a residential user with 2,807 CF of usage and \$4,780.59 for commercial with 20,594 CF of usage.

Below is a summary and comparison of the rate proposal provided at the March 21st meeting:

- 364 (or 89%) of our customers would pay only the monthly minimum, i.e. Base Rate (331 residential/33 commercial)
- 19 (or 5%) of our users will have a higher monthly bill (2/residential/17 commercial) between \$5 and \$1,765 per month. 5 users between \$5-\$50, 11 between \$51-\$250, and 3 >\$251 more per month.
- The maximum monthly bill is \$99 for all residential users regardless of usage and \$3,843.70 for commercial with 20,594 CF of usage.
