

The Woodland Trust and Woolsington Parish

Ancient woodland is a rich diverse habitat that now covers just 2.5% of the UK. Much of what we have left is being damaged and once it's gone, it can't be replaced. But through restoration we can stop the damage, encourage these habitats to recover and reverse years of decline.

We need to learn more about British trees; from identification, folklore and history to the pests and diseases that threaten them. Threats to woodland, wildlife and the wider environment are growing. Our trees and woods face a challenging combination of pressures, from humans, pests and diseases.

Through its Biodiversity Project the Parish Council is determined to help.
