Dunnichen Letham & Kirkden Parish Church Trustees' Report: Year Ended 31 December 2020

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the General Assembly Regulations for Congregational Finance, the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended) and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published on 16 July 2014.

Objectives and Activities

The Church of Scotland is Trinitarian in doctrine, Reformed in tradition and Presbyterian in polity. It exists to glorify God and to work for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom throughout the world. As a national Church, it acknowledges a distinctive call and duty to bring the ordinances of religion to the people in every parish of Scotland through a territorial ministry. It co-operates with other churches in various ecumenical bodies in Scotland and beyond. *In fulfilment of these objectives, services of public worship are held in the parish throughout the year. Pastoral care is exercised to all in need in the community by the locum ministers, the elders and members, where such need is known. Christian nurture and education is provided to children and adults of all ages. A branch of the Church of Scotland Guild meets during the winter months for worship, fellowship, learning and action on contemporary issues. The Church Hall is let out as a venue for community groups as well as providing a location for congregational activities and events. The Congregation is represented on the Presbytery of Angus*. From * to* are dependent on being allowed to be open.

Achievements and Performance

2020 was an exceedingly difficult year due to the COVID-19 virus. The church was closed for 6 months, from March to September. The number of people allowed to attend was limited to 50 then 20. Many of the congregation decided not to attend so the average weekly attendance at services during 2020 was approximately 29 people. Easter services were not held and there were considerably fewer people at the Remembrance Sunday service. The May Communion was cancelled and there were fewer than normal people at the November Communion. The church closed again at the end of December for an undefined period. There were no funerals held this year, although a memorial service was held for Rev. Shirley Thomas just before the church had to close. During lockdown, the Locum Minister presided over 3 funerals outwith the church. 4 other members' funerals were conducted elsewhere. Learning Together, a study group, was held on Monday mornings until lockdown, and is normally attended by, on average, 6 people. A monthly Men's Prayer Breakfast was attended by around 7 men, before closure of the hall. The 18 members of the Guild met monthly for only the first 3 months of the year for talks and discussions on the national theme recommended by the Church of Scotland but have still managed to raise funds for Guild projects and for the work of the congregation. For 6 months of the year the Publicity Group has prepared and distributed to every home in the parish a local newsletter (In the PICTure) containing church and community news. For the other 4 months ITP was produced with only about 200/300 copies being printed, but a digital copy was available on both the church and village websites. The General Trustees granted a loan of £15,000 over 5 years at a rate of 3% for the renovation of the church hall. The balance outstanding at 31st December 2020 is £4,500. Work will soon commence on the renovation of the grounds.

Financial Review

In 2020 the voluntary offerings of members made up 96.2% of income in our General Fund. Between 44 and 47 members contributed regularly to the Fund through contributions by Banker's Order, Freewill Offering envelopes or by cheque, accounting for £21,388 (including tax recovered on Gift Aided donations) with an unknown number contributing £2,948 through Open Plate offerings (including tax recovered under the Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme). Only £390 was generated from the use of the Church Hall by outside bodies, and nothing from funerals in the Church building. The members of the Guild gave generous donations of £300 to the General Fund and £300 to the Renovation Fund. The Trustees were able to transfer £300 from the designated Newsletter Fund to the General Fund. The Trustees decided to transfer the budgeted amount of £1,000 to the Redecoration Fund. All expenditure on on-going repair and maintenance of our buildings has been met from the Fabric Fund.

Reserves Policy

The charity trustees have considered the reserves required and have taken into account their current and future liabilities. It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves of approximately three months expenditure including designated funds. At the year end the Church held unrestricted funds of £22,132 of which £1,888 had been designated for fabric, £258 for the newsletter, and £260 for the Guild. The remaining balance of £19,726 represents about 9 months' expenditure, and while this is higher than would normally be expected, 2020 has been a peculiar year and the Trustees are aware that major work may be required on the heaters in the Sanctuary. The Trustees have set aside monies in restricted funds for the renovation of the Church Hall and grounds and the redecoration of the Sanctuary (see note 12).

Structure, Governance and Management

The congregation is a registered charity, number SC003833, and is administered in accordance with the terms of the Deed of Constitution (Unitary Form) and is subject to the Acts and Regulations of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.

The members of the Kirk Session are the Charity Trustees. The Kirk Session members are the elders of the church and are chosen from those members of the church who are considered to have the appropriate gifts and skills. An Interim Moderator and Locum Ministers have been appointed by Presbytery until such a time as the Presbytery Plan has been agreed.

The Kirk Session is chaired by the Interim Moderator and has met approximately 6 times in the past year, either through email or Zoom, to manage the spiritual affairs of the church as well as the practical, financial, and fabric affairs of the congregation. The Worship, Fabric, Publicity and Social Groups kept in contact by email, with the remaining 3 Groups (Finance, Pastoral Care and Youth) corresponding as required. The groups are composed of trustees along with members of the congregation and are responsible to and report regularly to the Session.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Dunnichen, Letham & Kirkden Parish Church

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020 which are set out on pages 5 to 14.

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

The charity trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1) (a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under section 44(1) (c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of independent examiner's statement

Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies, which have been applied consistently in the current and preceding year in dealing with items which are considered material to the accounts, are set out below.

Accounting Convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and The Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

Funds

Funds are classified as either restricted, unrestricted or endowment funds, defined as follows.

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific requirements as to their use which may be declared by the donor or with their authority or created through legal processes, but still within the wider objects of the Endowment funds are funds which have been given on the condition that the original capital sum is not reduced, but the income therefrom is used for the purpose defined in accordance with the objects of the charity.

Unrestricted funds are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are designated as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

Incoming resources

Income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, any performance conditions attached to the items of income have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donated services and facilities

Donated professional services and donated facilities are recognised as income when the charity has control over the item, any costs associated with the donated item have been met, the receipts of economic benefit from the use by the charity of the item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS102) the general volunteer time of congregation members is not recognised.

Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the charity; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the bank or deposit taker.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. Unrealised gains and losses represent the difference between the market value at the beginning and end of the financial year or, if purchased in the year, the difference between cost and market value at the end of the year. Realised gains and losses represent the difference between the proceeds on disposal and the market value at the start of the year or cost if purchased in the year.

Taxation

Dunnichen Letham & Kirkden Parish Church is recognised as a charity for the purposes of applicable taxation legislation and is therefore not subject to taxation on its charitable activities. The charity is not registered for VAT and resources expended therefore include irrecoverable input VAT.

7 Staff costs and numbers

The charity had no employees during the year under review.

All Church of Scotland congregations contribute to the National Stipend Fund which bears the costs of all ministers' stipends and employer's contributions for national insurance, pension and housing and loan fund. Ministers' stipends are paid in accordance with the national stipend scale, which is related to years of service. For the year under review the minimum stipend was £28,137 and the maximum stipend (in the fifth and subsequent years) £34,577.

During the year no trustee received and remuneration and no expenses were reimbursed. During the year a total of £8,602 was donated to the congregation by trustees.
